"This is the only crop insurance," our Supervisor explains, "the cost of which is based on actual production and loss information compiled by counties and by farms. Thus, through a period of better seasons, better farming and use of better seed, it is possible for a community to lower its risk rate. By a nation-wide system of handling the wheat, which repre sents premiums paid, and constitutes its reserve, from which indemnity payments will be made, the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation effects economies in the cost to the grower of this insurance, prevents much local business hardship in communities subject to crop failures and exerts Totals a stabilizing influence on prices.




