For home canners who have as-paragus in the garden, or can ob-tain it from a neighborhood witch, Grace L. Patterson, County Home Demonstration Agent, sug-sess some pointers on putting up this springtime favorite Only fresh, tender asparagus from the garden to can' is es-pecially important with asparagus because it may get stringy and will lose flavor when it waits and will so flavor when it waits and the source of the hours before canning. Keep it cold and moist. For aparagus at its very best harvest it in the early morning, be-day. Since asparagus arous rapidly, it needs to be cut every day im warm weather, and therefore canned in small batches. Gener-aby the shoots should be cut off about 2 inches below sround when they are from 6 to 7 inches high.
