| OLD GLORY <br> Fifty stars and thirteen stripes each star a symbol of the heavens and the divine goal to which man has aspired from time immemorial; the stripe a reminder of the rays of light emanating from the sun. And the colors, red, white, and blue, recognized throughout the This is our flag. <br> But how much do we actually know about this pennant that spells freedom of religion, of speech and of peaceable assembly; the right to bear arms plus other equally important rights that give each American security and protection so that no State shall deprive a person of life, liberty or property without due process of law. This could also be interpreted to include a man's reputation - one of his most valuable possessions. The story of the origin of our na- | \|tional flag is not unlike the history of our great country. We received our birthright from the peoples of many lands who gathered on these shores to build a new life and found a new nation. So, also, did the pattern of the Stars and Stripes rise from numerous origins back in the mists of antiquity to become emblazoned on the standards of our infant Republic. <br> The earlier flags used by our forefathers reflected their struggles in the new world. Oftentimes beavers, pine trees, rattlesnakes, anchors and various like insignia with mottos such as "Hope," "Liberty", "Appeal to Heaven," or "Don't Tread on Me" were used on the earlier banners. <br> However, the first flag to have any resemblance to the flag so familiar to us today was the Grand Union flag, sometimes referred (Continued On Back Page) |

flag and on June 14, 1777 the Continental Congress established the Stars and Stripes by Resolution even though they did not specify
the arrangement of the stars. Esthe arrangement of the stars. Escame a necessity so that our ships
at sea would be recognized and not mistaken for pirate ships. When the Star Spangled Banner was first flown by the Continental Army, General Washington is reputed to have said, "We take the
stars from heaven, the red from stars from heaven, the red from
our mother country, separating it by white stripes, thus showing that we have separated from her, to posterity representing liberty", As new states were admitted to the anion, it was first suggested Hat a star and a stripe be added
but it was soon recognized that the flag could become unwieldy so the law of April 4, 1818 proclaimed that a star be added for each new
state on the 4th of July after its admission. No change was made in the flag from 1912 with the admis-
sion of New Mexico and Arizona until 1959 when a star was added for Alaska and a year later our 50 th star,
statehood.
