In the main shop, hundreds of yards long, are rows of metal lathes, presses, and lines of cultaway instruments and display boards, all waiting for ex-servicemen to take their places before them.

In one corner of the huge shop, the first class of 20 returned soldiers convenes daily for 6 hours instruction in electric refrigeration repairs. Many of the men were placed there under the rehabilitation channels, having sustained 10 per cent disability or more. 
