Her gown was new, and she wore a blue garter.

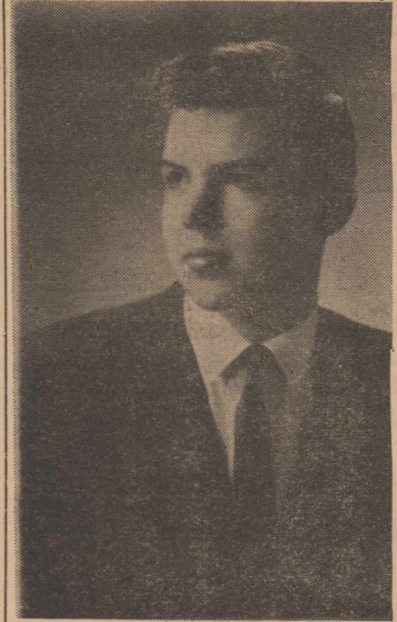

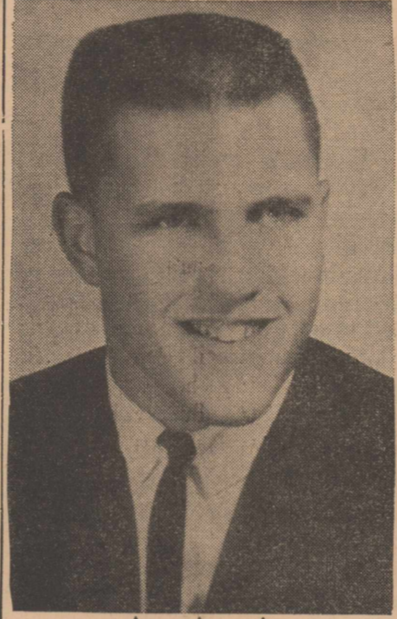
