Pastor Al Jennings Is Now At Home

The Rev. Al Jennings, pasto of First Methodist Church, is home again where he is convalescing from an illness that hospitalized him the last Sunday in May. The Rev. Jennings has been out of the hospital for about two weeks, but he stiil is quite weak and must rest a great deal of the time.

Pastor Jennings told the editor one day this week that the exact nature of his illness had not been determined at the last talk he had with his doctor.

There is a form of encephalitis and a form of meningtis that are so nearly similar that a special laboratory test is necessary to differentiate between the two and the reports of the test had not been received at his last talk with the doctor.

Bro. Jennings is due to go for a check-up within the next few days. He said that he felt sure that he would not be allowed to take up his duties as pastor before most of the summer is gone.

Meanwhile, the Rev. Lee Stanford, a retired Methodist preacher living at Dimmitt, is filling the pulpit at First Methodst Church here and at Flomot during the illness of the pastor.




