She died at 11:30 p. m. Thursday in St. Anthony's Hospital.

A former resident of this community, Mrs. Tyler, was born in Missouri. She had lived in Amarillo for the past eight years. At the time of her death she had been making her home with a daughter, Mrs. Lily Johnson.

She was a Baptist. In addition to Mrs. Johnson she is survived by daughters, Mrs. Myrtle Bashford of Amarillo, and Mrs. B. C.
