MAKE PLANS NOW FOR FERTILZING WHEAT
The time is once again ap
proaching to consider plans for ertilizing wheat to be planted
his fall. Since most soils vary in their ability to supply plant nutrients, the most logical starting point for determining fer-
tilizer needs is the soil test ilizer needs is the soil test. By sampling early, the re
port will be received in time fo making the final decision as to what kind and how much ferilizer to apply.
Nitrogen is the fertilizer lement likely to be in shortest supply. Organic matter as meas
ured by soil tests is one of suides for determining how nuch nitrogen will be needed. However, such factors as the mount and stage of decomosition of previous crop resi-
due, physical condition of the soil, ability to irrigate adequately and intended grazing prac-
ices will all influence the nitro-
gen need of the crop.
Data at the South Plains Re
search and Extension Center
clearly indicates that where
wheat is grown for grain only,
is of little importance. How ever, when wheat is to be graz-
ed, all or part of the nitrogen should be applied preplant to stimulate early growth. Adeauately fertilized wheat forage or contain 20 per cent protein
