Mrs. G. W. McDonald, 84, a former instructor at Wayland Baptist College and wife of the late ettes right down to the final buz-G. W. McDonald, fifth president of Wayland Baptist College from margin. 1924 until 1947, died last week in a San Angelo hospital where she had been since 1961.

Funeral services were held at 2 p. m. Friday of last week, December 29 in Plainview First Baptist Church. Burial was in Plainview Cemetery with Lemons Funeral Home in charge.

Mrs. McDonald was born Tonie Hemphill Oct. 4, 1883 in Hemphill County near Bastrop. She married Dr. G. W. McDonald in 1908. He died in September oof 1961.
