## ANNOUNCEMENTS MADE BY VALLEY TRANSLATOR SYSTEM

Before the start of a new year on December 1, 1978, I would like to make some announcements.

First, all the interest held by Mrs. Odell Setliff and her children in Valley Translator System has been purchased. It is now totally owned and managed locally.

Second, the rates will have to be raised for next year's service from $\$ 45.00$ to $\$ 55.00$ due to the following reasons:

1. Electric Power, rates have increased from approximately $\$ 25.00$ per month to a high of $\$ 200.00$ for the month of September 1978.
2. Parts for the Translators, such as tubes, etc., have increased in price over $500 \%$.
3. Insurance on buildings and equipment has increased from $\$ 250.00$ per year to over $\$ 1000.00$ last year.
4. Our Chief Engineer has raised his rates from $\$ 50.00$ a trip when needed to a monthly retainer of $\$ 265.00$.
5. A decrease in population of area served.
6. Every thing involved in operating the station has increased approximately $10 \%$ yearly the last few years.

Third, in the very near future I hope to be able to offer to our good paying customers another Channel such as the larger cities have.

been the topic of many hours of research by agricultural agencies the past 2 2.ars. As fuels grow higher in cost and equipment and its repair
grows higher again the farmer and rancher must change procedures and habits.

To explain a few, just 5 years ago it was economically feas-
ible to irrigate grasses to run cattle on. ible to irrigate grasses to run cattle on. Then the price of cattle broke making it impossible to make money even pasturing cattle
on dry grass and of course a big loss if you watered grass for on dry grass and of course a big loss if you watered grass for
pasture. For cash crop irrigation the farmer has had to use almost perfect timeing and the water very conservative to make grain crops pay.
The agricultural experiment stations over the area have
spent many hours these last two years 'developing the best spent many hours these last two years developing the best mifrom skip row planting to the use of smaller amounts of water at the right time. It would be wise for irrigation farmers to go
spend a little time with the fellows spend a little time with the fellows at the experiment station
if you haven't already before you set up your watering program
