TURKEY COUPLE ATTENDS NATIONAL FARMERS UNION CONVENTION

Mr. and Mrs. Virgil Blakney attended the National Farmers Union Convention in Kansas City, Missouri, recently. Texas delegates were Joe Rankin of Ralls, Charlotte Garner of Seminole, Kathy Harmon of Happy and Virgil Blakney of Turkey.

They arrived at the convention site on Saturday evening, and on Sunday Charlotte Garner and Mr. Blakney met with the National Policy Drafting Committee for several hours to try to improve national policy on cotton, rice and peanuts. Most of the Texas policy on cotton was entered. There was some improvement on rice, but the group failed to get any change on peanuts. The committee had worked several days and would not re-write much of its original policy. Texas came out better than most states, however.

On Wednesday, delegates moved and seconded to get peanuts amended to 100% parity, but failed again. The delegates knew it would not pass, but they stood pat for the Texas policy. They did get some more improvement on cotton passed on the floor.

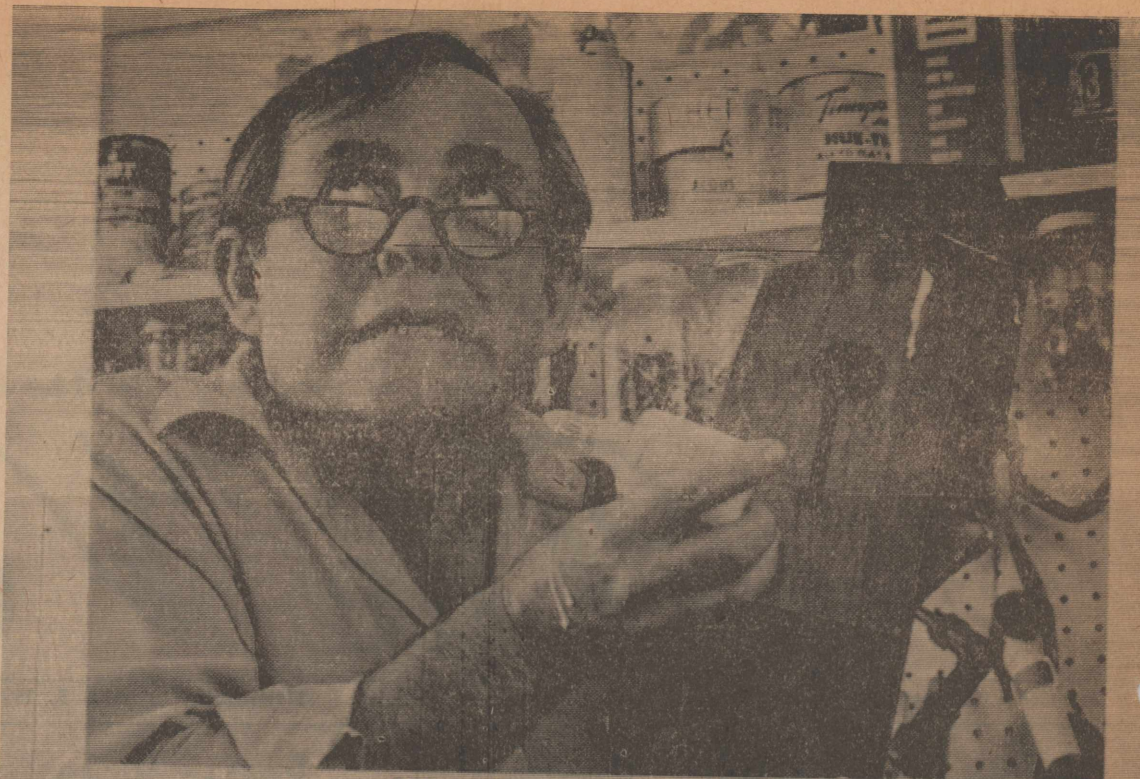
Secretary of Agriculture Bob Bergland spoke Tuesday evening. He stated that we need the Brannon plan. This was the Farmers Union plan and it worked well. Charles Brannon is former Secretary of Agriculture and is now the FU legal advisor and was seated by Mr. Bergland, who said if farmers get 100% parity the big farmers would soon buy the small farmers out and therefore he is against 100% parity. But he did say that if farmers could come up with a plan that would help the small family farmer he would try to do something about it.

Out of all the farmers from across the nation who attended this convention, it was Texas' F President, Jay Naman, who offered this statement and it was adopted: "Mr. Bergland, if you are sincere in your statement to help the family farmer we will meet with you at the earliest possible date." 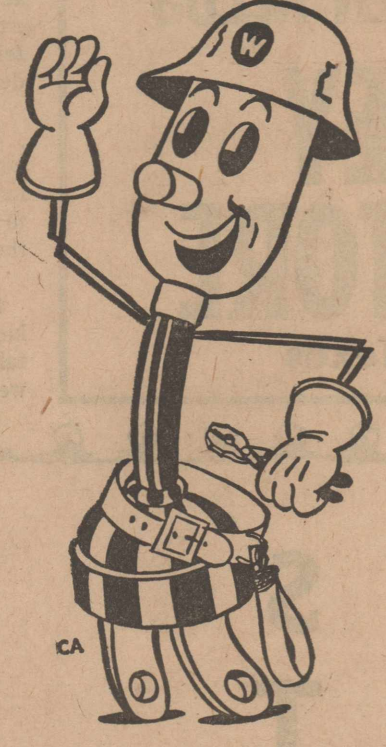

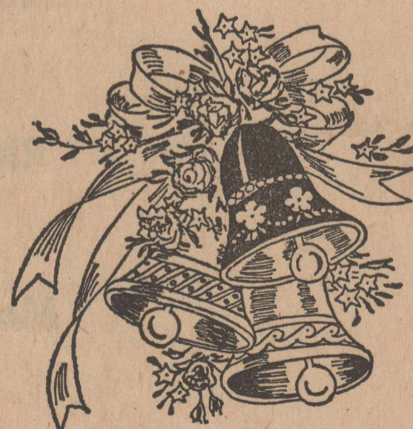

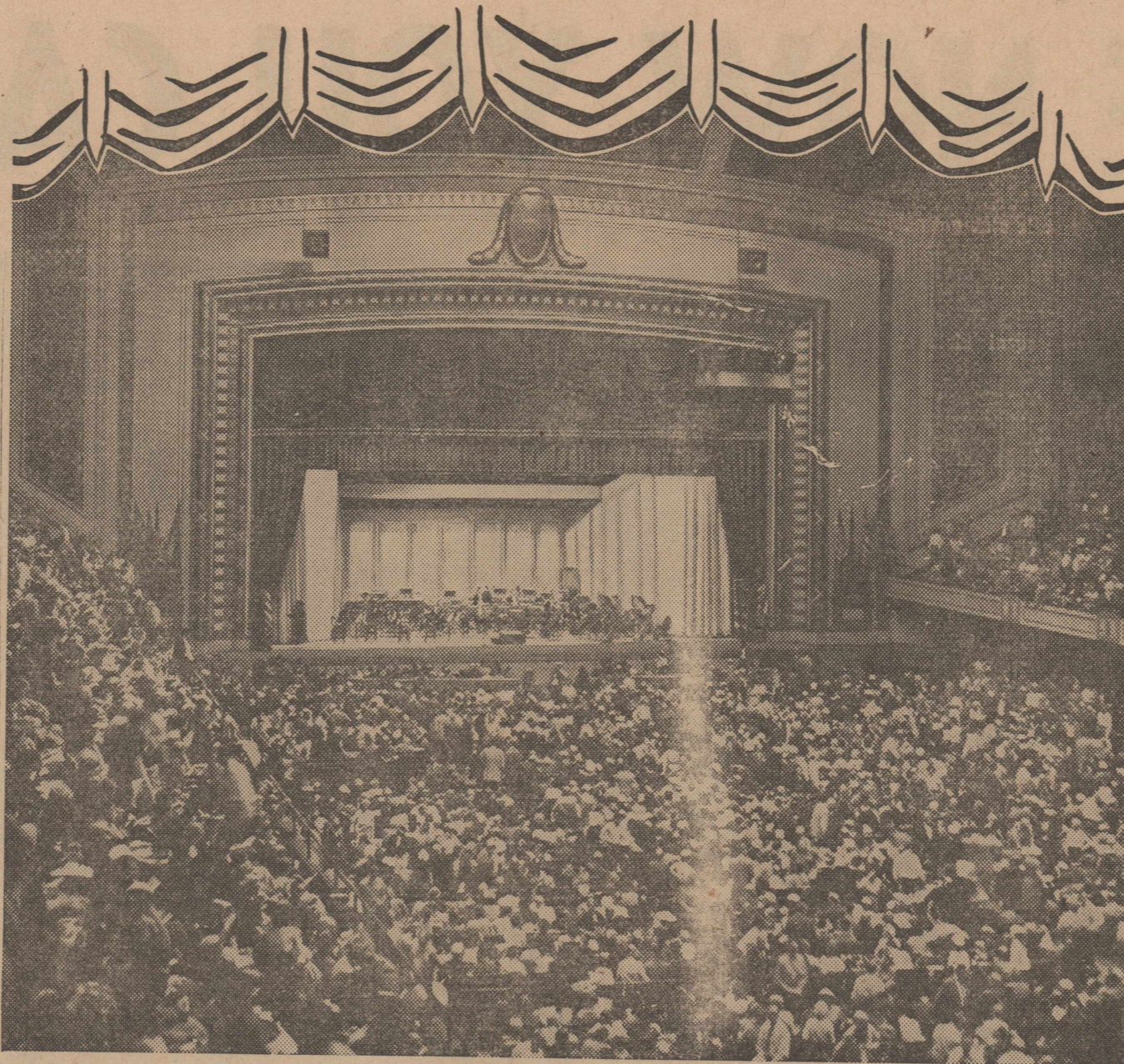
