I wish to fell you a little of my visit through the Hawaiian pineapele canning factory. This plant in the largest fruit canning plant in the largest fruit canning plant in the world.

We were escorted through by a Hawaiian grid. We went first to the dining room for the employes. It is a very nice large room, with table space for fifteen hundred people. The meal coost the workers forty cents a meal for a five course dinner.

Then we went to the room where the pineapples are peeled. There are about forty machines that peel the fruit. Each machine peels ninety pineapples a minute.



#### Summer Diseases Rampant Now

Austin.—This is the season when dysentery distribes and "summer complaint" are most prevalent in Texas, according to Dr. George W. Cox, State Health Officer, has issued a warning to parents of young children regarding the prevention of these diesases.

He said that the chief causes of these intestinal diseases are impure milk, water and food; allowing the child to become overheated; using too much sugar and cream in the diet; and under or over feeding.

The State Health Officer declared that with dysentery, as with many other diseases, the fly is an agent of transmission and every home should be well screened and free of flies.
