



Wheat stubble and straw may average more than 1,000 pounds per acre a year. It is already spread over the field ready to enrich the land. Stubble, when left on top or worked into the soil increases the organic matter content, increases the moisture holding capacity of the soil, improves soil tilt and fertility, prevents soil from blowing or washing, keeps down weeds, kills grasshopper eggs, holds plant food in place and supplies a home for organisms.

These results are obtained from the practice of using as a mulch on cultivated fields the residues of top growth of crops grown on these fields. This can be done by tilling the soil with implements that leave these materials on or near the surface.


