U.S. House passes bill to restrict abortion access JUDGEMENT DAV: Bill makes transporting minors across state lines for abortions a federal offense without parental notification.

Pro-life Republicans made great strides Wednesday when the U.S. House of Representatives passed a bill that restricts access to abortions for minors.
The bill must be passed in the Senate and signed by the president before becoming a law.
The Child Interstate Abortion Notification Act would make it a federal offense to transport a minor across state lines for an abortion to circumvent parental notification laws, unless a judge has issued a waiver.
Sarah Wheat, Sarah Wheat, public affairs director for NARAL Pro-Choice of Texas, said Texas has a parental notification law and if the House bill becomes a law, it would affect many teenagers in Texas.
"If you are under the age of 18 in Texas and
to notify.. at least one parent," she said.
In the 34 states with laws in effect that mandate the involvement of at least one parent in the abortion decision, teenagers who cannot tell their parents must either travel out of state or obtain approval from a judge - known as a judicial bypass procedure - to obtain an abortion, according fo the Planned Parenthood Web site.

"In some places, it's easier to go to another state to have an abortion," she said. "It's not always to avoid the laws."

Texas House passes proposal banning same-sex marriages

The Texas House of Representatives passed a proposal Monday banning same-sex marriage in Texas. Rep. Warren Chisum, R-Pampa, proposed Article 1 to the state constitution, if approved by Texas voters.
in Texar shall convw.texasinsider.org, marriage exas shall consist only of the union of one man and one woman. The ban passed through the House by a vote of 101-29. Texas, according to the Web site, would become the 1th state to have constitutional
legislation against gay marriages along with legislation against gay marriages along with
neighboring states Oklahoma and Louisiana. Page Heisser, vice president of the Texas Tech Student Association for Marriage and Family Therapy, said the bill may pass in Texas as a state amendment but may not p
amendment to the U.S. Constitution. - "It may create more momentum, but I think the American people will let it pass as a constitutional amendment," she said. Wes Wright, a senior electrical engineering and math major from Austin, agrees there would be momentum created toward a national bill.
"I think there would beabig push if Texas did pass it," he said. "But I really don't think there is a chance in hell that it would pass nationally." The New York Times recently reported a bill being passed by the Navajo Nation in Califomia that bans same-sex marriages. According to the Times, the tribal council
supported the bill with a vote of $63-0$, but still supported the bill with a vote of $63-0$, but still
must wait for the approval of Joe Shirley Jr., Navajo Nation president.
The Texas Senate and registered voters must approve the bill before it can become an amendment to the state constitution. The Web Site www.religioustolerance.org

## Study finds happiness lowers heart disease

The study's findings showed people who claim or tend to lead happier lives have lower levels
of "stress-inducing" chemicals, which raise a person's chances for heart disease and diabetes. The study discovered even when "happier people experienced stress, they had low levels of a chemical which inctase the risk of heart disease." as the test subjects and had their vital signs, such as blood pressure and heart rate, monitored throughout their days from work, personal time and leisure.
