sign a petition to have resident only parking on their street. The permit itself costs $\$ 50$. After the initial permit fee, each automobile will cost $\$ 5$ per year.
"Before, anyone could get a permit to park on restricted
streets," he said. "But now we are making streets," he said. "But now we are making the people who park on these streets prove that they live in the houses they are parking in front of."

families or supertar athletes, one organization is reaching out to people who didn't quite make the honor roll. The United States Commission for
cholastic Assistance, a Virginia based Scholastic Assistance, a Virginia based
scholarship organization, is offering scholarship organization, is offering
a non-merit based scholarship called
"Sch"Scholarships for 'CC' Students." Few Texas Tech students and em ployees agree with the overall concept of awarding students for low grades,
nor do they find much validity with nor do they find much validity with
the organization. the organization. "Why settle for a C?" said Sh. eryl Haggard, scholarship adviser at the scholarship office. She also said scholarships should not be awarded to students who underachieve aca-
demically. demically.
"Sudents shouldn't be able to have an all C scholarhhip," Haggard said. "When you are talking scholarship, (people) are talking merit."

The Raiders will travel to College Station to battle the Aggies after Tulane plays a game first. Todd said it will have a more tournament-like atmosphere and get everyone a lirtle more pumped up for the match.
The No. 20 Aggies ( $7-4,0-2$ ) are on a two-match losing streak, and Raiders are realizing what they need to do to keep ahead of $A \& M$ and not have a repeat of last year.
