Church mourns after pastor's electrocution

WACO (AP) — The University Baptist Church band had just led the congregation in praise songs when the Rev. Kyle Lake stepped into a tank on the stage to baptize a new member, something he did several times a year.

But then the pastor cried, "Get me out!" and fell backward.

The packed room of more than 800 people, mostly Baylor University students and their families in town for homecoming weekend, weren't sure if he was serious or if it was a skit. Several doctors in the Sunday morning crowd rushed to the stage, pulling Lake out and tending to him until an ambulance arrived.

Lake, 33, was pronounced dead at a hospital, the victim of electrocution. Some at the service said Lake had adjusted a microphone outside the tank, while others said it appeared that a piece of equipment fell into the water. Witness accounts also vary about the

"It happened so fast; no one knew what was going on," sáid Sam Larson, a Minneapolis seminary student.

Commuters scramble during transit strike

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Commuters laced up their walking shoes, pedaled bicycles, squeezed into car pools and hitched rides Monday as a transit strike brought the city's buses, subways and trolleys to a halt.

Nearly half a million people had to find other ways to get to work or school after contract talks broke down late Sunday between the Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority and the Transport Workers Union. One in three households in Philadelphia has no car.

"I'm not happy. How can you be happy?" Chris Hambrose said as he waited for a ride from his home in South Philadelphia to his job in North Philadelphia, a trip that normally takes 14 minutes by subway. "But if these people feel that they have to strike, you can't take that away

Carol Bridges of South Philadelphia walked all the way up Broad Street to her job downtown. "I don't like it, but it's good exercise," said Bridges, 51.

No new talks were scheduled between SEPTA and the union.

Bird flu found in wild Canadian ducks

TORONTO (AP) — Nearly three dozen wild ducks have tested positive for the H5 bird flu virus in Canada, officials reported Monday, but they said it was unlikely to be the strain blamed for more than 60 human deaths in Southeast Asia.

Dr. Jim Clark of the Canadian Food Inspection Agency said it would take at least a week to determine whether the flu found in 33 ducks from the provinces of Quebec and Manitoba was the deadly H5N1 strain that has ravaged Asian poul-

But it was unlikely to be the same strain because none of the wild ducks tested was ill, he said at a news confer-

"That strain in Asia has caused high mortality in those birds; the birds that tested positive in Quebec and Manitoba are all healthy," Clark said.

Clark said 4,800 samples had been collected from wild birds in seven Canadian provinces.

Wheels on party buses may not go 'round and 'round

Tech students and Lubbock residents may not be able to ride around town aboard party buses anymore if the City Council has their

One week after 26 minors were ticketed for underage drinking on the Ruby Tequila's party bus, the Lubbock City Council is looking to ban party buses.

"We had a very serious situation aboard one of the party buses last week," Mayor Marc McDougal said "We need to a look a the problem.'

The council wants to repeal a 1981 ordinance that allows buses to take large groups of people from bar to bar and drink alcohol around town.

McDougal said the council's decision is not solely based on the Ruby Tequila's incident.

"We have had numerous complaints from residents around town," he said. "They are complaining of upwards of 30 to 40 people coming into their neighborhoods and causing a disturbance."

McDougal said he does not believe the buses serve their original purpose of eliminating drunken drivers.

"There is a difference between getting people home safe and having a rolling bar,'

Seven U.S. troops die to end bloodiest month since Jan.

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — Capping the bloodiest month for American troops since January, the U.S. military reported Monday that seven more U.S. service members were killed — all victims of increasingly sophisticated bombs that have been become the deadliest weapon in the insurgents' arsenal.

Bombs also claimed a toll Monday among civilians in Basra, Iraq's second-largest city and the major metropolis of the Shiite-dominated south, which has witnessed less violence than Sunni areas. A large car bomb exploded along a bustling street packed with shops and restaurants as people were enjoying an evening out after the daily Ramadan fast. At least 20 were killed and about 40 wounded, police Lt. Col. Karim al-Zaidi said.

Military commanders have warned that Sunni insurgents will step up their attacks in the run-up to the Dec. 15 election, when Iraqis will choose their first full-term parliament since the collapse of Saddam Hussein's regime in 2003.

To guard against such attacks, the military has raised the number of American troops in Iraq to 157,000 — among the highest levels

Supreme Court should enforce Geneva Convention's rules

Tere's a court case you probably haven't heard about: Hamdan v. Rumsfeld. The Supreme Court is deciding this week whether or not to take it up. Hamdan deals with the rights of the foreign suspects the Bush administration is holding at Guantanamo Bay Naval Base, Cuba.

Two courts ruled on it this summer. The first said the president didn't have the right. The second - the Court of Circuit - reversed that decision July 15. Judges A. Raymond Randolph, Stephen Williams, and now-familiar-face John excuse. Roberts presided.

With that affirmation came a symbolic approval for the White House to conduct this kind of business with the widest kind of legal interpretation — meaning no constraints needed.

The current policy is a blatant violation of the Constitution and the Geneva Convention. Chief Justice Roberts said he would recuse himself if Hamdan is of the justices to do the same.

The Hamdan of the case — Salim Ahmed Hamdan — is a Yemenese man we captured in Afghanistan, late November 2001. He was transported to Cuba and held at Camp Delta. He was Bin Laden's driver and personal aide.
