lation" reports that the administration was planning for a military strike against Iran. Bush did not rule out the use of force, but he said he would continue to use diplomatic pressure to prevent or the know-how and technology to make one. "I know here in Washington prevention means force," Bush

Previews in Los Angeles and New York already have drawn intense scrutiny and emotional
reaction. Time magazine reported audience members in Hollywood shouted "Too soon!" as the trailer was screened; a New York theater pulled the trailer after audience
complaints. "United 93 " is the first feature film to deal explicirly with the events of Sept. 11 though there was a made-for-TV special movie on A\&E in January.
The new film is certain to ignite an emotional debate before and

soon? Should the film have been made at all? Time says other Sept. 11 projects are on the way as the fifth anniversary of the attacks nears, most notably Oliver Stone's
"World Trade Center," starring Nicolas Cage, opening Aug. 9 .
