In many ways，things are worse
today than they were then．Our tax code is truly irrational and tax day
has become an embarrassing na－ tional symbol of waste and abuse． Every year，Congress adds，ex－
tends and changes the deductions， credits and other special prefer－ ences in our tax law．Because of these loopholes，compliance is a
nightmare and the overall com－ plexity is mind－numbing．Worse， the final result often is unfair． taxpayers wist sim iar incomes can
game the system and pay vastly dif－ ferent amounts in taxes． In fact，the U．S．Department of
Treasury now estimates the total cost of complying with the income tax at $\$ 125$ billion a year．（Other estimates are as high as $\$ 194$ bil－

| GRAIN VALLEY, Mo. (AP) <br> -The library books on multiple births crowded the couple's coffee table. The bedroom-turned-nursery awaited the arrival of six newborns. <br> But in the end, authorities say Sarah and Kris Everson never had the sextuplets as claimed. All they had was what appears to be a big lie. <br> The couple's dramatic story had holes in it from the start - from their mysterious withholding of information for more than a month to the unanimous response of area hospitals that they hadn't helped deliver the newborns. <br> On Tuesday, authorities said the mystery had been solved - the entire tale was deemed a hoax aimed at tapping the generosity of others to pay the couple's mounting bills. <br> "I have never dealt with anything | like this," Police Chief Aaron Am- front page a photograph of the couple brose said. "The level of fraud like this involving people, I have not." <br> Gary Bradley, the city administrator, said charges against the Eversons were forthcoming.
