In all, 558 people were named in the list provided by the Pentagon in response to a Freedom of Information lawsuit by The Associated Press. They were among the first
swept up swept up in the U.S. global war on
links to al-Qaida or the Taliban.
The list is the first official roster of Guantanamo detainees who passed through the Combatant Status Review Tribunal process in 2004 and 2005 to determine
whether they should be deemed "enemy combatants," whether they should be deemed "enemy combatants."
Those named are from Afghanistan, Saudi Arabia Those named are from Agghanistan, Saudi Arab prison at Guantanamo Bay for more than four years. Only a handful have faced formal charges.
Some names are familiar, such as David Hicks, a
Muslim from Australia charged with fohting Muslim from Australia charged with fighting U.S. and
coalition forces in Afghanistan. He is onh of 10 detainees selected to be tried by a military tribunal, on charges of attempted murder, aiding the enemy and conspiracy to commit terrorism.
Hicks allegedly
Hicks allegedly fought for the Taliban, and Australian news media have said British authorities contend
he admitted undergoing training with British Islamic he admitted undergoing training with British Islamic
extremists, including Richard Reid, who was convicted extremists, incluading Richard Reid, who was convicted

Lesser-known detainees on the list include Muhammed al-Qahtani, a Saudi who reportedly was supposed to be the 20th hijacker in the Sept. 11 terror
attacks. Although his presence at Guantanamo had been reported, the military had previously declined to confirm it.

Partial, unofficial lists of Guantanamo Bay detainees have been compiled in the past by news organizations, lawyers and human rights groupss. The U.S. had previously
declined to release any list of names except the 10 who have been formally charged.
Even with the latest release, the Pentagon has not pro vided a full list of all the more than 750 prisoners that the military says have passed through Guantanamo. The release of the list on Wednesday, ordered by a federal judge, came amid wide criticism of the almost total secrecy the United States now holds about 490 detainees. "This is information that should have beens released a long time ago, and it's a scandal that it hasn't been," said
Bill Goodman, legal director of the New York-based Center Bill Coodman, legal director of the New York- based Center
for Constitutional Rights, which has helped coordinate legal efforts on behalf of Guantanamo detainees. The combatant status hearings at Guantanamo Bay were held from July 2004 to January 2005 after the Supreme Court fuled that the detainees had the right to contest their status Aefore a judge or other neutral decision-maker.

# Teaching for America 

 Graduates dedicate two years to ensuringstudents' success in low-income schools By RUTH BRADLEY

When Katrina Petney was at-
tending Texas Tech, she said she
sometimes felt a little lost in the
shuffle. She recalls waking up in
the morning wondering whether
anyone would notice if she didn't
make it to class. Since she began
to work for Teach America,
things have changed.
"If was gone for a day, my kids
would notice," she said. "My kids
would care."
Petney, who graduated from
Tech with a bachelor's degree
in biochemistry in May 2005,
now is a corps member of Teach
America, a national organization
dedicated to eradicating educa-
tional inequality.
"Teach For America's goal is to
level the playing field for children
in low-income communities,"
said Jackie McCarthy, commu-
nications manager for Teach for
America.
The program deals with this
problem on a long-term and
short-term basis.
The short-term begins with
students like Petney, recently
graduated leaders with expertise
in their field of study, who work
for two years as teachers in low-
income areas. income areas.
According to the organiza tion's Web site at www.teacha-
merica.org, there currently are merica.org, there currently are
3,500 of these corps members teaching in more than a thousand schools in 22 low-income areas across the country.
Petney said the work corps
members do is vital to the success members do is vital to the success of the nation as a whole. "America is based on the edu-
cation of our youth," she said. "Aon of our youth," she said.
But for many a good education is elusive because of regional and personal income.
"That's deciding basically your future and your opportunities," Petney said. "That's just
injustice." injustice." Though she is now a propo-
nent and active corps member, as a biochemistry corps member, as she didn't always plan on teaching. She is not alone; Petney said only 2 percent of corps members working for Teach for
majored in education.
"They're looking for people
in all majors," Petney said. "If you know biology, you can teach biology."
Corps members also are geo-
graphically diverse. According to graphically diverse. According to
the organization's Web site the organization's Web site, corps
members for 2005 come from
360 colle these, close to 95 percent held leadership roles at their college campus. "They are strong critical think-
ers and leaders," McCarthy said ers and leaders," McCarthy said.
New corps members are
trained for their rigorous summer institute where they learn to teach under the supervision of other teachers,
McCarthy said. Many obtain additional training from a local
university after they begin university after they begin work
at their placement school. They also receive additional support from a Teach for America staff
member. member.
