session. Rove appeared at ease after being questioned, joking to reporters to "move to the back" as the White House aide, his lawyers and several reporters climbed on the elevator to leave the building.
Rove's lawyer issued a statement saying Rove's appearance was sched-
uled at Fitzgerald's request. "In connection with this appearance, the Special Counsel has advised Mr. Rove that he is not a target of the investigation" and that no decision had been made concerning charges,
