## Rice visit aims to bolster Lebanon government

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — In a surprise visit to a battered Beirut, Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice praised the prime minister of Lebanon on Monday for trying to contain the fighting between the Hezbollah militia and Israel, but there were signs that her trip disappointed Lebanese leaders.

Prime Minister Fuad Saniora told Rice that Israel's bombardment was taking his country "backwards 50 years" and called for a "swift ceasefire," his office said.



### Heat prompts power emergency in Calif.

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Power companies worked to restore electricity to thousands of customers throughout California early Monday as a scorching heat wave threatened to push the state into a power emergency with the potential for more blackouts. Authorities were looking into several deaths possibly related to the high temperatures, which hit the triple digits in some areas on Sunday.

## Ind. Police scour roads for sniper clues

SEYMOUR, Ind. (AP) — Investigators scoured hundreds of miles of highway for clues to a killer after two sets of sniper attacks within hours of each other left one man dead, another wounded and four vehicles peppered with bullet holes. A day after the attacks, police were still trying to identify potential suspects and searching for any witnesses who might have seen the shooter.

## Fighting rages at Lebanon-Israel border

SIDON, Lebanon (AP) — Israeli ground forces pushed deeper into Lebanon on Monday in heavy fighting and captured two Hezbollah guerrillas, while two aid convoys carrying food, generators and other badly needed supplies left Beirut for two southern cities. Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice made a surprise visit to Beirut to launch diplomatic efforts aimed at ending 13 days of warfare. Prime Minister Fuad Saniora told her his government is hoping to "put an end to the war being inflicted

global warming. These are true not because they have been proven to be, but because they have to be, that's the only answer, end of story. Yet these are the claims made in "An Inconvenient Truth."



Hezbollah, Israel both need to take blame for Mideast problems

T n the middle of the 1800s, Sicilian farmers became fed up with being Loverly taxed on the fruit they grew by the Italian government. As a means of retaliation, they formed what is now known as the Mafia, an organization that used whatever means necessary to secure fair treatment for themselves and their family, both legal and illegal. Though the Mafia became infamous for their criminal activity, one finds reluctant admiration for those willing to stand up for themselves in the face of oppression.

Currently, violence between the Israeli army and the Lebanese militia known as Hezbollah has grabbed the attention of the world and its leaders. Though Hezbollah is demonized by the media as a militant Islamic group, they are in some ways similar to those men of Sicily who took a stand against mistreatment. Israel allows its military to carry out unprovoked attacks against both the Lebanese and the Palestinians in the Gaza strip. Both the Israelis and Hezbollah launch excessive bombing campaigns in which women and children are killed.

Regardless of these facts, many world leaders still view Israel as a country defending itself with Hezbollah as the aggressors. As reported in the July 17 issue of Newsweek, President Bush ttu.edu.

commented to British Prime Minister Tony Blair at the G-8 conference, "what they need to do is get Syria to get Hezbollah to stop doing this shit, and it's over," what a classy guy our president is. But the reality is both sides are overly violent, and it is ridiculous to demand that Hezbollah stop when Israel refuses to.

Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice currently is in the Middle East, meeting with officials on both sides and trying to broker a peace. # Fire crews battle SoCal wildfires in sizzling heat

FOREST, Calif. (AP) — A fast-growin San Diego County early Monday after prompting calls for evacuations, as hot, windy weather sapped the endurance of firefighters.

The blaze in Cleveland National Forest had grown to 6,000 acres about 9 square miles — and prompted voluntary evacuations of hundreds of homes near Lake Morena, said Roxanne Provaznik of the California Department of Forestry.

The blaze was moving south to southeast and away from homes, but it

Shyamalan's latest release falls short of expectations

NEW YORK (AP) — Morgan Spurlock, who created the documentary "Super Size Me" and the television show "30 Days," says the reality TV boom has been good for documentaries.

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
