U.S. coal plant boom poses environmental dilemma

DALLAS (AP) — A building boom that would add scores of new coal-fired power plants to the nation's power grid is creating a new dilemma for politicians, environmentalists and utility companies across the United

Should power companies be permitted to build new plants that pollute more but are reliable and less expensive? Or should regulators push utilities toward cleaner burning coal plants, even if it means they will cost more and are based on newer, yet still unproven, technology?

How those questions are answered will have huge implications over the next few decades. It could determine how Americans light, heat and cool their homes and business, the rate of return on utility investments and the potential environmental impact of the new plants.

Rudy Fleming, 21, faces life in prison without the possibility of parole in the killing last year of Nicole duFresne.



The British military should "get ourselves out sometime soon because our presence exacerbates the security problems," Gen. Sir Richard Dannatt told the Daily Mail in the interview released on the tabloid's Web site.



WASHINGTON (AP) — The questioned ex-Rep. Mark Foley's one-time chief of staff, who challenged Speaker Dennis Hastert's account of his office's first notification of Foley's conduct toward

Kirk Fordham testified in private as investigators sought to learn who is telling the truth. Fordham said he gave the information to Hastert chief of staff Scott Palmer in 2002 or 2003, but Palmer has disputed Fordham's account. Hastert's office said his staff was first told about Foley last fall.

Republicans received a new indication Thursday that the Foley scandal is hurting their chances of retaining control of the House.

Rep. Jo Ann Emerson, R-Mo., said in Cape Girardeau that GOP leaders made a mistake in failing to take quick action to address Foley's conduct. She said the controversy and the public's frustration with the war in Iraq could make it

John Shimkus, only acting as a mentor to the boy. Shimkus ordered Foley to cease contact with the boy, apparently without notifying Kildee or Capito.

Finalist for chancellor not yet named

Texas Tech officials deny local news reports that a finalist has been chosen for the chancellor position.

Reports indicated that Kent Hance, a former U.S. congressman, had been

named the finalist for the chancellorship following a meeting with the selection committee. Sally Post,



director of news bureau and broadcasting for the Texas Tech Office of Communications and Marketing, said any announcements regarding the chancellor position would have to come directly from the Board of Regents to be considered accurate.

"The board has not made any announcements yet regarding the naming of the candidates or who might be selected as a finalist," Post said. "Any such announcement will be done at a meeting of the board when a full board authorizes an action to that effect."

Regent Mark Griffin said there is no way to confirm or deny the validity of the reports about Hance because no meetings have been conducted to give indication either way. "Its speculation at this

point," Griffin said. "Anything you're seeing on the news reports right now is certainly not based on a vote or decision of the board."

While a finalist is likely to be named within the near future, Griffin said the regents have made no more progress in the search since their last meeting.

"Since the conference call a few weeks ago, we've heard nothing else," he said. "I have nothing new to offer."

Post said she does not know who the local news stations' sources are, but the only legitimate information about the chancellor search would have to come from the regents.

"The only people who know who is on the short list is the regents," Post said. "There's nothing we can say until the board gets around to naming a finalist or finalists."







Dell computer company announces battery recall

Dell Inc. has recalled approximately 100,000 batteries sold with the Latitude, Precision, Inspiron and XPS notebook computers, according the Dell Web site. The recall is in light of the possibility these certain units could overheat. The overheated batteries have a chance of leading to a fire, according the Web site.

The notebooks at risk are the following models:

Latitude D410, D500, D505, D510, D520, D600, D610, D620, D800 and

Inspiron 500M, 510M, 600M, 700M, 710M, 6000, 6400, 8500, 8600, 9100, 9200, 9300, 9400, E1505 and E1705;

Precision M20, M60, M70 and M90;

XPS, XPS Gen2, XPS M170 and XPS M1710.

The batteries were not just sold along with the computers. The recalled batteries will also include any sold separately as a replacement. The batteries in question were sold during the time period of April 1, 2004, to July 18, 2006, according to the Web site.

The Dell Web site warned that someone should not use his or her current battery while waiting for the replacement.

Vitaly Churkin said the U.S. should wait for the results of more diplomacy. China's U.N. Ambassador Wang Guangya agreed, saying Beijing would welcome more talks so the Security Council can send a united and forceful message to Pyongyang condemning its claimed nuclear test.

Churkin said "the international community will easily understand if on the matter of this gravity and importance, the Security Council will take a few more days to have a reasoned and united response to the challenge we face from this explosion in North Korea."

"We think that there should be a strong reaction, but it has to be a coolheaded reaction," he said.


Without naming the United States, Churkin appeared to take aim at the tough U.S. policy toward Pyongyang and President Bush's inclusion of North Korea in the so-called "axis of evil."

Tam in a howling mood today. Not because Halloween is a mere 18 days away and not because I did something crazy last night, but rather for the stellar performance of one 5-foot-7 running back for Northern Illinois: Garrett Wolfe.

In six games, Wolfe has 1,343 rushing yards and 13 touchdowns, nearly eclipsing his 2005 mark when he accrued 1,580 yards and 18 touchdowns. Wolfe currently averages 223.8 yards per game. With a 4-2 record, NIU needs just two wins to become bowl eligible. The Huskies have the opportunity to play eight more games this season with six regular season games remaining plus a possible berth in the MAC Championship game and a bowl game. If NIU gets eight games and Wolfe maintains his average yards per game, the senior tailback could wind up with 3,133 yards rushing for the season, obliterating the NCAA Division I-A record of 2,628 yards held by Barry Sanders of Oklahoma State in 1988.

If Wolfe even gets close to Sanders' all-time mark, he should be one of the top candidates for the Heisman Trophy at the end of the season.

So what if he doesn't play for a BCS conference. Wolfe rushed for 171 yards against an Ohio State defense that held Texas to 175 rushing yards as a whole.

Also, the MAC has provided some of the top talent to the National Football League including Randy Moss, Chad Pennington and Byron Leftwich (Marshall), Ben Roethlisberger (Miami, OH), Antonio Gates (Kent State), Charlie Frye (Akron), Bruce Gradkowski (Toledo) and Jason Babin (Western Michigan) — all who start for one of the 32 NFL teams.



If I could vote for Wolfe to win the Heisman, he would be my selection despite the numbers Ohio State's Troy Smith and Ted Ginn Jr., Notre Dame's Brady Quinn or Georgia Tech's Calvin Johnson put up at the end of the season. Wolfe should be the leader of the Heisman pack.

Not only did Tech receiver Robert Johnson drop a key touchdown in the fourth quarter of last week's game against Missouri, but now the sorrow continues for the Red Raiders as he and Fletcher Session will not be making the trip to Boulder Saturday.
