

# Republicans block tax increases for oil companies

WASHINGTON (AP) - Republicans blocked a proposal Thursday to tax the oil industry an additional \$29 billion, while the Senate moved closer to an agreement on raising automobile fuel economy for the first time in nearly 20 years.

The tax package was aimed at channeling billions of dollars to

other alternative energy resources. But many Republicans said it was too harsh on the oil industry and could lead to less production and higher gasoline prices.

The struggle over the tax provision signaled that Democrats may have a hard time pushing through the broader energy bill, which tilts

subsidize windmills, hybrid cars and heavily toward promoting energy overcome strong auto industry conservation and renewable fuels and away from support for traditional fossil fuels.



NEW YORK (AP) — Billy Ray Cyrus is crossing his fingers that his daughter, "Hannah Montana" star Miley, won't go the way of Lindsay and Paris and Britney. He even shows her articles about the Hollywood troublemakers as cautionary tales.

So far, so good.

"The biggest phenomenon in all this is that the kid's been able to keep her head on her shoulders," the 45-year-old country singer tells People magazine in its new issue. "She hasn't flipped out. I'm going to knock on wood."

He adds: "I pray every day she can stay on that path."

Cyrus, who recently completed a stint on ABC's "Dancing With

the Stars," co-stars with 14-yearold Miley on the hit Disney Channel series "Hannah Montana," about a country-girl-turned-pop-star who tries to keep her celebrity life a secret from her classmates. ### Birkhead: Dannielynn has 'chubby' toes, long legs like her mother

NEW YORK (AP) —When Larry Birkhead looks at his 9-monthold daughter, Dannielynn, he sees her mother, Anna Nicole Smith.

"She has long legs and chubby little toes exactly like Anna's; it's like a mirror image," Birkhead tells OK! magazine in its latest issue. "It's really incredible. And I think her lips are her mom's lips; especially when she pouts. ... She also gets what she wants exactly like her mom always did as soon as she'd pout."

Smith died in Florida in February. She was 39. The former Playboy Playmate gave birth to Dannielynn in September, a few days before the death of her son, Daniel, 20, in the Bahamas.

Howard K. Stern, her lawyer and companion, initially claimed to be Dannielynn's father, but Smith's ex-boyfriend Birkhead eventually showed he was the father.


