More than $1 / 5$ of Lubbock County residents illiterate

## By GLENYS BOLLS

More than 21 percent of Lubbock Count residents cannot read.
Of Lubbock Counts, 254862 54,000 adults in Lubbock County are illitentate, according to the Report on the State of Adult Literacy in Texas.
"We have a huge literacy problem," said Carol Keenev, executive director of the Lub bock Area Coalition for Literacy. "A lot of people are dropping out of school, a lot of
people are migrant workers. A lot of people people are migrant workers. A lot of people
have learning differences where they can't learn in a normal school setting." Amy Wilson, director of education at
Sylvan Learning Center, said the problem of Sylvan Learning Center, said the problem o illiteracy begins at a young age but can hav ramifications throughout a person's life.
"It's more of a problem than people rea Wilson said. "We have a lot of kids come into the center whose parents didn't know that they were behind the normal reading leve for their age. That's at least 75 percent of the cases we see."
Many adults
Many adults who go to the Lubbock Are Coalition for Literacy have specific goals for their educations, Keeney said.
At Literacy Lubbock, the number on request we get - and we'll get at least 600 this year - is to get a better job," she said. "Number two is help me get a better educa tion to help my children.' These are the people who are courageous, motivated, honest and When told of the 54,000 illiterate Lubbock
Whent County residents, Wilson had an immediate response.
response.
"What happened?" she asked. "That's very disheartening. It's something we hope to ad dress when people are in school.
One major problem is the state of Texa does not put much
tion, Keeney said.
"Texas ranks last on spending in adule education," she said. "People don't realize what a problem we have. We have an immense problem, and the odd thing about it is, the answer to it is not that hard.'
Keeney said the coalition can educate one student for a year for $\$ 350$ whereas a year in prison, which is often the aiternative, can cos
$\$ 40,000$ for one person. Wilson said functional illiteracy is a lem just as troubling as total illiteracy. "There have been studies about adults who are functionally illiterate," she said. "Technically they can read, but they don't understan anything they're reading.'
America report of 1998 , Texas ranks 47 th in literacy out of all 50 states, and 28 percent of Texas adults lack basic literacy skills.

can cause human health prob can cause human health prob-
lems by inhabiting an animal intestinal tract and contaminat ing the meat.
He said Tech researchers hav developed a yogurt-like bacteria, which when added to an animal's
diet has been found to reduce the levels of E. coli in the animal. "It competes with the pathogenic E. coli and Salmonella so
that bacteria, which is a positive that bacteria, which is a positive
bacteria, ends up out-compet ing the pathogenic bacteria so that the levels you have ar
eliminated or very low," he said eliminated or very low," he said.
"Once it leaves the feed yard and goes to be harvested and made into steaks and hamburgers, the
level of E. coli will be very low for potential contamination." Researching ways to preven
E. coli contamination can b beneficial to the beef industry by preventing contaminatio by preventing contaminatio
recalls, said Todd Brashears, a assistant professor in the Depart ment of Agricultural Educatio and Communication who con ducts educational research with the center.

## Students try to set Twister board record

FARGO, N.D. (AP) - With lots of stretching and reaching toward blue, red, yellow and green circles, some 40 high school students played Twister on 180 mats in what they hope will set a world record for the largest Twister game board.
Sunday's night attempt took place during a conference held over the weekend by North Dakota DECA, a high
State DECA adviser Kevin Reisenauer, of Bismarck, was confident. "We will break the record."
The students won't know for sure until officials at Guinness World Records review a video of the attempt.
The mats formed a Twister board measuring 4,699 square feet. The current Twister board record was set in April 2005 in the Netherlands, at 2,453 square feet.
DECA, which stands for Distributive Education Clubs of America, aims to improve education and career opportunities for students in such areas as management and entrepreneurship.
"There truly is a process to it, and we learned a lot," Reisenauer said.
