Bush tells Musharraf to hold elections

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Bush, personally intervening in the political crisis in Pakistan,
oold President Perve? Musharaff on Wednesday he must hold parliamentary elections soon and step down as army leader.
"You can't be the president and the head of the military at the same time," Bush said, describing a 20 -minute telephone call with Musharraf. "I had ery frank discussion with him."
It was Bush's first contact with Musharraf since he declared emergency rule on Saturday and granted
sweeping powers to authorities to crush political dissent.
Bush reveealed the call to Musharraf during an appearance with the French president, Nicola Sarkozy, at George Washington's home in Mount
Vermon, Va. Vermon, Va.
For several days, the White House has faced ques tions about why Bush was taking a relatively soff line Musharraf, whom Bush has called a friend he trusts.
