The accident near Victoria early on the morning of Jan. 2 killed one passenger and seriously injured several others. In all, 47 people were aboard the bus traveling from Monterrey, Mexico, to Houston

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) - Sweden and Norway dropped plans Wednesday to send about 400 troops to the U.N. peacekeeping force in Darfur because of opposition from Sudan's government.





## Texas attorney general announces identity theft protection lawsuit launch

#### **By ADAM YOUNG News Editor**

Texas Attorney General Greg Abbott announced the filing of a state lawsuit accusing a Levelland facility owned by a Pennsylvania rehabilitation company of violating state identity theft protection laws.

At a press conference in Lubbock Thursday, Abbott said the lawsuit accuses Select Physical Therapy Texas Limited Partnership and Select Medical Corporation of exposing its clients records, including Social Security and bank account numbers, to identity theft.

"We're trying to send a message to businesses across the State of Texas: 'you have a responsibility to shred or redact information in your records that contains personal identifying information of your customers, Abbott said.

In the lawsuit, the attorney general requests a fine of up to \$500 for each record containing personal identifying information and civil penalties of up to \$50,000 for each because of identity theft. violation.

## US protests Iranian harassment of US warships in Persian Gulf

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States on Thursday lodged a formal diplomatic protest with Iran over an incident last weekend in which Iranian speedboats harassed U.S. warships in the Persian Gulf.

The protest repeats U.S. complaints about Sunday's "provocative" action in the Strait of Hormuz and was sent to the Iranian Foreign Ministry via the Swiss Embassy in Tehran, which represents U.S. interests in Iran, the State Department said.

"It reiterates the points that we have made publicly in the last few days," deputy spokesman Tom Casey told reporters. "We certainly don't want to see the Iranians taking any kind of provocative actions or provocative steps against our ships or against any ships that are transiting what is a primary international waterway."

In Tehran, Iranian Foreign Ministry officials said they were unaware of the U.S. protest.

At a Pentagon news conference, Defense Secretary Robert Gates said the Iranian boats had acted "in a pretty aggressive manner."

"What concerned us was first the fact that there were five of these boats and, second, that they came as close as they did to our ships and behaved in a pretty ag-

gressive manner," he said. The Bush administration had been considering the move for several days, debating whether a formal protest would have any impact on Iranian behavior, given numerous

"We all understand what happened in this incident," he said.

The Pentagon maintains that, Iranian naval speedboats swarmed around U.S. warships in a threatening manner and released its own video of the incident in which a man in accented English says, "I am coming to you. ... You will explode after ... minutes.'

In Israel on Wednesday, Bush warned Iran not to repeat such actions, which he said would draw "serious consequences."

Iran denies its boats threatened the U.S. vessels, and accused Washington of fabricating its video. The Pentagon has dismissed that claim and warned that its ships would respond with force if threatened.

The grainy 5-minute, 20-second Iranian video shows a man speaking into a handheld radio, with three U.S. ships floating in the distance. It appeared to be shot from a small boat bobbing at least 100 yards from the American warships. But the footage does not show any Iranian boats approaching the U.S. vessels or any provocation.


itself, and that this "truth" must be revealed to the world.

## Lax FBI money controls lead to shutdown of surveillance, Justice Department audit finds

phone companies have cut off FBI wiretaps used to eavesdrop on suspected criminals because of the bureau's repeated failures to pay phone bills on time.

A Justice Department audit released Thursday blamed the lost connections on the FBI's lax oversight of money used in undercover investigations. In one office alone, unpaid costs for wiretaps from one phone company totaled \$66,000.

In at least one case, a wiretap used in a Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act investigation "was halted due to untimely payment," the audit found. FISA wiretaps are used in the government's most sensitive and secretive criminal and intelligence investigations, and allow eavesdropping on suspected terrorists or spies.

"We also found that late payments have resulted in telecommunications carriers actually discondeliver surveillance results to the FBI, resulting in lost evidence," according to the audit by Inspector General Glenn A. Fine. More than half of 990

offices were not paid on time, the report shows. Assistant FBI Director John Miller said wiretaps were dropped only a few times because of the backed-up bill-

ing, which he said didn't significantly set back the investigations under way. He said the FBI "will not tolerate financial mismanagement, or worse," and is working to fix the problems.

"It seems the telecoms, who are claiming they were just being 'good patriots' when they allowed the government to spy on us without warrants, are more than willing to pull the plug on national security investigations when the government falls behind on its bills," said former FBI agent Michael German, the ACLU's national security policy counsel. "To put it bluntly, it sounds as though the telecoms believe it when the FBI says the warrant is in the mail but not when they say the check is in the mail."

The audit also found that some field offices paid for expenses on undercover cases that should have been financed by FBI headquarters.

That's primarily because of the research that we've done at this level at Texas Tech."

Another \$1.6 million in funding will go to the College of Engineering to further the development of nano-photonic technology, Hance said, which has the potential to be revolutionary in the scope of utilizing electricity more efficiently.

"One of the applications in existence right now on a larger scale is light-emitting diodes (LEDs)," said Jeff Sammons, senior editor in the College of Engineering. "There is so much more that can be done with nano-photonics in decreasing the size of the light emitting - not just necessarily these LEDs - but decreasing the size and using lower energy, etc.'

Center for Food Industry Excellence, \$350,000 will go to the Center for Border Health, \$95,000 will go to the Center for Cardiovascular Disease and Stroke and \$526,636 will fund programs in the West Texas Center for Influenza Research, Education and Treatment.

Rep. Randy Neugebauer, a member of the Texas delegation that worked to obtain the funding, said local communities know their needs best, which is why he submitted requests to Congress for the funding, according to his Web site, www.randy.house.gov.

"(Neugebauer), himself, is a Tech (alumnus), and he realizes that the research that is being done can help create new jobs," said Michael Frohlich, communications director for Neugebauer's office, "so people won't necessarily have to go to Los Angeles, New York, Washington or Boston to keep high-tech jobs."




