International performance artist Tim Miller addressed gay isues through
a comedic performance in what he called a "queer night at Tech." The Association of Creative Writing at Texas Tech hosted Miller's "Sex Body Self" performance and lecture at 8 p.m Thursday in the Human Science building

Even after a decade, that oldtimer e-mail probably remains your login on the numerous Web sites you

Lycos relic, however, the Internet is constantly changing, which is a good thing for us users.
Web mail veterans Hotmail and Yahoo! Mail have gotten a fresh coat of paint, and relative newcomers like Gmail are showing that innovation leads to success. But how
that contribute to a victory? Windows Live Hotmail, form MSN Hotmail, has been around for 12 years and recently in 2007 was rebuilt with an AJAX interface that focused on simplicity, speed and security. This was great news to hear,
because until then Hotmail had been because until then Hotmail had been
stuck in the time where design barely kept pace with what was already poor functionality.
Unfortunately, Hormail's redesign leaves everything with only a cliché

## Harrell-Freeman chosen

 as marquee matchupThe matchup between Texas Tech's Graham Harrell and Kans
ash Freeman will garner a little extra attention this weekend
Josh Freeman will garner a little extra attention this weekend.
The Dave O'Brien Foundation highlights marquee match week this season between two quarterbacks featured on the Dave O'Brien Award list. The list recognizes candidates in line for the award which honors the best quarterback in the nation at season's end. Past marquee Matt Grothe and BYU's Matt Hall and Washington's sake Locker Th week's matchup will be between Harrell and Freeman
"WYe always tiv to select the best puree auaterbacto matchup," said Danielle Moorman, executive director of the O'Brien Foundation. "That's really what were going for is to highlight the quart terbacks. We just didn't think there was a better game out there than the Tech-Kansas State game this weekend. We think it'll be a real good offensive battle between the two.
Harrell enters Big 12 play completing 120 -of- 186 passes for 1,573 yards, 12 touchdowns and three interceptions. The passing yards are second in
the nation to Houston's Case Keenum. Freeman has completed 77 of 115 passes on the season for 1,105 yards, 11 touchdowns and two interceptions. His passing yards rank 24 th in the nation.
Moorman said the matchups this year have varied from many different conferences and many different teams.
"We've had a lot of (Southeastern Conference), Big 12 (Conference), (Pacific-10 Conference), Mountain West (Conference)," she said. "It really There are 10 Big 12 quarterbacks on the list this season. Some beside Freeman and Harrell included Baylor's Robert Griffin, Missouri's Chase Daniel and Oklahoma's Sam Bradford.
Fans will impact the outcome for the O'Brien Award for the second year in a row. Moorman said fans can visit voteobrien.org to vote for their favorite quarterback to be a semiinnalist. She said the top three vote setters automatically will be added to the foundation's semifinalist list, determining the finalists and the winner for the award, Moorman said. The semifinalists will be announced on Oct. 27 and the list approximately will be 15 to 17 quarterbacks.
Harrell is seventh with 472 votes, while Freeman is 27 th with eight. The leading vote-getter currently is Texas' Colt McCoy with 2,839 and bunting. Last year, Horidas

## Tech travels to Kansas State for Big 12 opener
