Government launches new loan aid effort

VASHINGTON (AP) - The governWASHINGTON (AP) - The govern-
ment and the mortgage industry are launching ment and the morngage sweeping effort yet to help troubled homeowners by speeding up the process for renegotiating hundreds of thousands ofdelinquent loans held by Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac. The Federal Housing Finance Agency, which seized control of the two mortgage the plan Tuesday along with other government and industry officials, including Hope Now, an alliance of mortgage companies organized by the Bush administration last year.
"Foreclosures hurt families, their neighbors, whole communities and the overall housing market," said James Lockhart, the housing nance agency's
downward spiral."
The plan could have tremendous importance because Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac own or guarantee nearly 31 million U.S. mortgages, or nearly six of every 10 outstanding. Still, government officials did not have an estimate of how many people would qualify for the new program.
Officials hope the new approach, which goes into effect Dec. 15., will become a model for loan
servicing companies, which collect mortgage companies and distribute them to investors. These companies have been roundly criticized for being slow to respond to a surge in defaults. To qualify, borrowers would have to be at least three months behind on their home more than the home is currently worth. Inves tors who do not occupy their homes would be excluded, as would borrowers who have filed for bankruptcy.
Borrowers would get help in several ways. The interest rate would be reduced so that oorrowers would not pay more han 38 percen option is for loans to be extended from 30 years to 40 years, and for some of the principal amount to be deferred interest-free.

Experts warn diabetes affects college students, too


The number of people in the
United States diagnosed with diabetes has more than doubled in the last 15 years, according to the
Center for Disease Control and Prevention, and while about 23.6
million Americans have been diag nosed, an estimated 5.7 million do not know they have the disease, The American Diabetes Association in Lubbock raises awareness
about the seriousness of diabetes and funds education, research for the cure and prevention, and advocacy, said Martha Atwood
executive director of the associa tion in Lubbock.
"We just had our ' 15 th Annual Step Out: Walk to Fight Diabetes
at Mackenzie Park," Atwood said "WWe had 1,900-plus people and "We had 1,900 -plus people and rased a little more than $\$ 226,000$
for diabetes education, research for diabetes ed
and advocacy."

blood glucose levels are higher than blood glucose evels are higher tha

The symptoms of Type 2 dia-
betes occur slowly over time, Hust

include extreme thirst, frequent urination, tiredness, blurry vision, hat will not heal.

makers are in deep trouble. For in-
stance, General Motors shas orouhly
$\$ 40$ billion of debt and is losing more than $\$ 1$ billion every month, according to Yahoo! Finance.
However, we must ask ourselve However, we must ask ourselves
if these failed companies are worth saving with our taxpayer dollars.
Let's look at Ford more closely.
Ford's debt load, $\$ 166$ billion, is as tronomical. $\$ 166$ billion is roughly eight times the annual budget of
the State of Colorado; Ford doesn't have a prayer of paying this much
debt off. Ford is, like General Motors,
losing roughly $\$ 1$ billion a month They have a negative profit mar-
gin, meaning that their average car sells at a loss. Add it all up, and
you see their present situation is hopeless.
The simple truth is that our products that people don't want.
They've made gigantic gasguzzling vehicles while their for-
eign competitors have made small eign competitors have made small
efficient cars that made far more sense in our resource-constrained
world.
The American auto companies completely and utterly failed to
