Hispanic enrollment inconsistent with Texas population

## By Hamah boen Staff Writer

Lubbock officials predict one-third of the popula tion of Lubbock will be Hispanic by 2010.
But campus statistics tell a different story about Hispanic presence at Texas Tech
"The growth of student enrollment is more of a reverse procedure, meaning when Tech enrollment grows, Lubbock grows," said Senior Planner David Buckberry.
The City of Lubbock Web site reported a 24.7 perto 2008, bringing Lubbock's total Hispanic population to 31.8 percent, a percentage which is consistent with Texas as a whole.
Karl Eschbach, a demographer for the state of Texas, said 32 percent of the state's current population is Hispanic. He expects Texas' Hispanic population to increase to 36 percent by 2010, but he said the population growth is not consistent with Hispanic presence at college campuses across the state.
"I know that Hispanic college enrollment lags behind the population growth," Eschbach said. "We are aware that enrollment rates for this ethnicity fall
behind the total number of Hispanics in behind the total number of Hispanics in Texas." According to Tech's Institutional Research and

Information Management Web site, 9.8 percent of
enrolled students were Hispanic in the fall semester enrolled students were Hispanic in the fall semester versity's enrolled students were Hispanic. While the number of Hispanics enrolled is increasing slightly, Rosa H. Gallegos, associate director of Tech's Cross-Cultural Academic Advancement Center, said she believes family plays a large role in the number of Hispanic students attending college in Texas, and family support is important to Hispanic enrollment.
"Building their own family on campus is important," she said, "because that's the way students compensate or not having their own family here." Hispanicgos ackndenowledged that the small portion of Hispanic students on Tech's campus is inconsistent
with the Hispanic population statewide. "WVe Hispanic population statewide.
"We're at about 12 percent right now," she said, "but that's a very tiny part of the whole student body."
As Tech attempts to grow total As Tech attempts to grow total enrollment, Gal-
legos believes the number of Hispanic students will legos believes the number of Hispanic students will
grow too, and the Cross-Cultutal Academic Advancement Center is preparing to welcome a more diverse student body.

address the issues of these struggling automotive companies or our economy," he said in a statement. "Congress must draw the line somewhere. We cannot keep writing blank checks, expanding our national debt and leveraging our children and grandchildren's future.
Neugebauer said the federal government must be held accountable for the total cost and exposure put on taxpayers. "Congress also has an opportunity to take a step back and reassess how funds not yet committed from the bailout legisla,
tion should be used or whether these funds are still needed," he said.

Michelle Richmond, Neugebauer's communications director, said the congressman believes it is wrong for Congress to pick winners and losers in the economy.
"Congressman Neugebauer has always been concerned about government intervention in our financial markets," Richmond
said. "He voted no against the first economic rescue package be said. He voted no against the first economic rescue package be-
cause he believed the legislation was not the best way to solve the problem. He continues to believe that American taxpayers, who made conservative lending and investment decisions, should not have to pay for the mistakes made on Wall Street."

Tech officials hired a LEED-accredited professional, Hugh Cronin, to help
design the university's new building, expected to be completed by fall 2011 . Cronin, the project manager of Broaddus \& Associates, was hired to manage the project and said there are some benefits to green buildings.

Enforcing the sanctions poses steep challenges, however, as those responsible for much of the anarchy plaguing the country are well outside any traditional finance system. framework to stem the provide a finto Somal ia which is arm
