Preserves with no sugar is possible

Knight-Ridder Newspapars How would you like to use less sugar - or no sugar
at all - with the fruits you can or preserve this If you were told in the past that non-sugared jellies you've come to expect, you should welcome the news that home economists have been busy testing recipes
and products designed for those who want to limit sugar intake.
One such product is called a jelling mix. The
directions say just pour non-caloric sweetener, stir in a package of the product, boil one Eace and store Eand 1 -and-three-quarter-0unce package contains a recipe leaflet with the information of how much of your choice of sugar, artificial
sweetener and honey to add for each type of fruit jam or jelly. Although refrigerated storage is recommended, these jelling-mix jellies will store in any
cool, dry place. The jelling mix does not work with coil
frozen jams and jellies.
Recently, home economists for the makers of Recently, home economists for the makers of
unflavored gelatin have developed a new and easy unflavored gelatin have developed a new and easy
way to make jams and jellies with only 10 to 30 calories per tablespoon (usual calorie count is 60 per
tablespoon). Using the unflavored gelatin reduces tablespoon). Using the unflavored gelatin reduces
the large amounts of sugar usually required in
cooking these two categories of food. It also reduces cooking time to a bare minimum.
Sugar indicated in most conventional jam and jelly Sugar indicated in most conventional jam and jelly
ecipes helps thicken as well as sweeten the product. The unflavored gelatin takes care of the thickening;
for sweetening a small amount of sugar or an or sweetening a small amount of sugar or an
equivalent amount or arfificial sweetener will do.
The gelatin jellies require refrigerator or freezer The gelatin jellies require refrigerator or ireezer
storage but do not require sealing with paraffin Fresh fruit, canned fruit and unsweetened fruit
juices can be used as the basic ingredient. Granulatjuices can be essed as the basis ingreedient. Granulat-
ed sugar works best tas the sweetener (brown sugar ed sugar works best as the sweetener (brown sugar
does not jell well.). Honey may be used for part of
the granulated sugar in proportions of 25 percent the granulated sugar in proportions of 25 percent
honey to 75 percent sugar. When a sugar substitute is
used, the directions advise stirring it into the ecipe when cooking is complete. This is because cooking sometimes causes artificial sweeteners to
leave a bitter aftertaste.

ting covers. Labests should be dated Recommended refrigerator storage time is up to four weeks. The

"I don't think you can ignore the fact that this is an lection year," Pevar said in a telephone interview prised if Andrus talked to Carter about it." He noted that President Carter had a shaky match against Harmon Kallman, a spokesman for Anlrus.ma. said. II really wouldn't want to comment" on the statements. "Whey're kind of ridiciculous." He denied the
deceision was politically motivated. Kallman said Andrus "made no mention of the president getting involved" in the decision.
