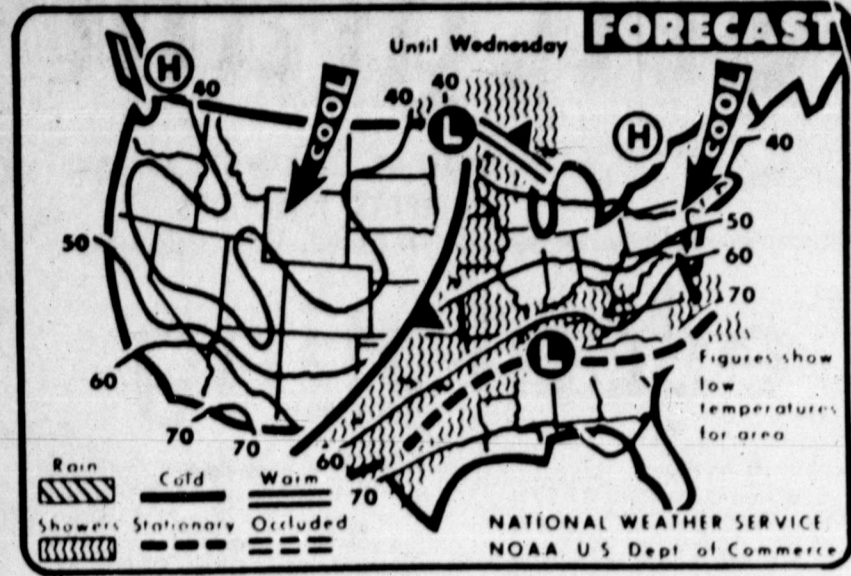




**WEATHER SUMMARY**

**Indira Gandhi armed with power to jail anyone for year without trial**

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — Prime Minister Indira Gandhi has armed herself with the power to jail anyone for a year without trial, raising fears of a return to her 1975-77 emergency rule. But the government says it has provided safeguards against misuse of the new preventive detention ordinance.

A government statement said the new government powers were required to combat "communal disharmony, caste conflicts, social tension, atrocities against minorities and other weaker sections of the society, and increasing tendencies on the part of various interested parties to engineer agitation on different issues."

Returned to office in January on a law-and-order platform, Mrs. Gandhi has been under growing criticism because of the violence. The ordinance provides that anyone held under it must be informed of the reason for detention within 10 days and given the opportunity to challenge the order. Advisory boards headed by High Court judges are to be set up to review all detention orders and to hear detainees.

**Full-service gasoline prices in Midland among highest**

Full-service gas stations in the Midland-Odesa area ranked among the highest priced cities to obtain gasoline, according to a survey conducted by the American Automobile Association of gas prices through mid-September. The survey of 432 service stations around the state shows that the average price of full-service regular gasoline had fallen by 1.1 cents per gallon to 118.4 cents. Prices of other grades of gasoline had decreased by nearly 1 percent. In the Midland-Odesa area, average price of regular gasoline at full-service stations was 119.4 cents per gallon. Unleaded gasoline at the full-service stations averaged 122.6 cents

statewide, and 123.9 cents at Midland. Self-service prices were lower. The average price of regular at these do-it-yourself stations statewide was 112.8 cents while Midland's was 111.5 cents. Unleaded in Midland was 116 cents while it was 117.9 cents statewide. The study also shows that availability of gasoline has improved slightly on weekday nights with 52 percent of the stations pumping gas after 8 p.m. It also reveals that 59 percent of the stations are open on Sundays with 10 percent open 24 hours a day. A few stations are closing earlier on Saturdays, with 69 percent closing after 6 p.m., compared with 73 percent in August, according to the survey.

Two Britons die in bombing of Iraqi complex

LONDON (AP) — The British Foreign Office said today at least five people, including two Britons, were killed in a morning Iranian bombing attack on a petrochemical complex near Basra, Iraq.

At the same time, a spokesman reported that Foreign Secretary Lord Carrington in New York had a talk with United Nations Secretary General Kurt Waldheim on the Iraq-Iran crisis.

Waldheim has been in touch with both the Iraqi and Iranian governments, possibly in order to arrange a special session of the Security Council, the spokesman said.

The Iranian air raid took place early today on the chemical complex at Zubair, near Basra at the southeastern tip of Iraq on the Persian Gulf. Aside from the five killed there were other casualties, including a third Briton. No identities were available.

Altogether there are about 1,000 Britons in Baghdad and 500 working in other parts of Iraq.

Investigating officers found that all the bedroom drawers had been ransacked, as well as a closet. Jewelry box drawers had been scat-

Two piggy banks were taken into the living room and emptied on the couch. However, they contained Mexican money which was not taken.

The refrigerator door also was found open and some lunch meat — minus a few bites — was found on the den table.

Delores Hinojos told police a Seiko watch, wedding band with diamonds, gold and silver chains, a gold chain with a cross, 12 assorted pairs of earrings, two baseball

gloves, a baseball bat, eight silver dollars and a baseball were missing. Total value was placed at \$1,450.

Entry to the house was through the bathroom window.

Also on Monday, Martin Allday reported a \$700 burglary at his home. The burglary reportedly occurred Aug. 17.

Entry was gained by entering the garage door. Taken from the garage were a portable television, three fishing reels, a fishing rod, 30 to 40 lures, miscellaneous fishing equipment, a plastic shell box containing four boxes of 20-gauge shells, a pair of tan deerskin hunting gloves, a shirt and hat and great hunting vest.

Total value was estimated at \$737.

A 16-year-old youth was in custody this morning in connection with a burglar alarm that sounded late Monday at David Crockett Elementary.

Officers said the alarm sounded at 11:54 p.m. at Crockett Elementary, 401 E. Parker Ave. When police arrived they found the youth in the building.

# Carter stumping in Reagan's territory

LOS ANGELES (AP) — President Carter is hunting votes in Ronald Reagan's home territory, telling Californians that they face a "peace or war" choice at the polls on Nov. 4.

With that refrain, Carter campaigned in Torrance, at a state AFL-CIO convention in downtown Los Angeles, and at a Democratic fundraising reception in Beverly Hills, when Sen. Edward M. Kennedy urged his supporters to rally to the man who beat him.

Carter was appearing today in San Jose, Portland, Ore., and Tacoma, Wash., before heading back to the White House where he is due shortly after 3 a.m. on Wednesday.

At a question-and-answer session Monday at Torrance high school, Carter said the current fighting between Iraq and Iran could speed the release of the American hostages.

"It could convince Iran that they need peace with their neighbors, that they need to be part of the international community, they need to be able to have a strong and viable economy, they need to get spare parts for their military weapons and so forth, and therefore induce them to release the hostages," Carter said.

"I'm not predicting that, but it's a possibility," Carter said.

He also said that "the signals coming out of Iran lately" have indicated a new desire to resolve the hostage situation.

Carter told the California AFL-CIO convention the state will be vital in determining who wins the White House.

"I don't intend to lose California," he said.

Carter has lost it every time he's run so far, to Gerald R. Ford by fewer than 140,000 votes in the 1976 presidential election, to Kennedy in the primary election this year, and to Gov. Edmund G. Brown Jr. in the primary four years ago.

Reagan, twice elected governor of California, has won easily in two statehouse elections and two presidential primaries.

With 45 electoral votes at stake, Carter's strategists say they're not conceding a thing in California, but acknowledged that they must campaign uphill to

catch Reagan.

"The outcome of the election could very well depend on the electoral votes from California," Carter said Monday night at a fundraising reception that produced about \$350,000 for Democrats. "This will not be an easy task, to beat Ronald Reagan in his home state. That is a noble goal, which I'm sure you share with me."

Carter said the election choice is not just between candidates and parties, but between two futures.

"What you decide on that day, you and those who listen to your voice, will determine what kind of life you and your families will have, whether this nation will make progress or go backward and whether we will have peace or war," he told the labor convention.

That was a more pointed rendition of a line from the standard Carter campaign speech.

In Springfield, Ill., on the way west, Carter said the 1980 choice is sharper than any since Republican Sen. Barry Goldwater faced President Lyndon B. Johnson 16 years ago. Johnson won a landslide after a campaign in which he painted Goldwater as a rash Republican who would risk war.

Carter has tried a similar theme in his campaign, although he periodically tempers it by saying, as in Cleveland a week ago, that he doesn't mean to insinuate Reagan "is for war and against peace."

Since the Democratic national convention, Carter had said repeatedly that Reagan wants to turn away from strategic arms limitation efforts that have been pursued by presidents starting with Dwight D. Eisenhower.

In Torrance, Carter said the election poses an awesome choice. "It will help to decide whether we have war or peace," he said.

"We are committed to peace," he said in Beverly Hills. "We've had 3 1/2 years when our nation has been at peace. Not a single soldier has been sent into combat, and I pray God we'll have the same success in the next four years."

Carter said he has dealt with crisis after crisis in the White House, but "you never knew about them," because they were settled successfully. "Had I handled the crisis improperly, or had I made an

incorrect judgment, that crisis would be a vivid issue in your minds and perhaps would have endangered the safety and peace of the entire world."

Kennedy, who once argued that California was the kind of state he could carry and Carter could not, urged Democrats who once supported him to work just as hard for Carter.

"We are facing a crucial crossroads," Kennedy said, "between the forces of negativism, the forces of reaction, the forces of retreat — and the forces of hope, the forces of opportunity, the forces of progress."

The White House announced Carter will make campaign appearances in New York City next Monday, in Flint, Mich., on Oct. 1, in Dayton, Ohio, and Philadelphia on Oct. 2, and in Bristol and Nashville, Tenn., and Winston-Salem, N.C., on Oct. 9.

# Anderson experiences ups and downs of campaigning

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — One day after appearing before millions of television viewers, John B. Anderson got a sharp lesson in the ups and downs of political campaigning.

Several thousand persons turned out in Chicago on Monday afternoon for a first-hand look at the man who debated Republican nominee Ronald Reagan. But Anderson was greeted with a sea of empty chairs when he arrived a few hours later at Philadelphia's Civic Center.

In Chicago's Daley Square, hundreds of red, white and blue helium-filled balloons rose into the sky behind Anderson just before the independent candidate delivered a thumping speech which drew repeated cheers.

In Philadelphia, there were more balloons than people.

Civic center officials said they set out seats for about 3,200 persons, and about 800, almost all college students, came for the widely-advertised rally.

The Philadelphia Eagles football team was on Monday night television, and the Phillies baseball team, a pennant contender, was also playing.

"I am getting used to competition of this kind," Anderson said with a laugh.

The students applauded

loudest when Anderson attacked Reagan's proposal to abolish the federal Department of Education.

"I say make the Department of Education work," Anderson said as many of the balloons popped from the heat of overhead lights.

As for Reagan's call to follow lessons of the past, Anderson cracked "I don't think he's going to give us the golden age of Pericles."

At a news conference, Anderson bitterly attacked Carter's refusal to appear in a three-way debate.

# Cubans cheer Reagan speech

MIAMI (AP) — Ronald Reagan was talking about crime when he ignited an explosion of cheers, sign-waving and snake dancing in the aisles in the heart of Miami's Cuban-American community.

Halfway through a sentence deep in his speech, Reagan said crime had been aggravated here because "among the thousands of fine, freedom-loving Cubans who have recently come to our shores..."

The rest of the sentence was drowned in whistles and chants of "Viva, viva."

They cheered again when he completed the sentence, saying, "you know and I know that among all those thousands of fine people who have come here in search of freedom, there is a small percentage of hardened criminals deliberately dumped here by Fidel Castro."

The crowd's tumultuous reaction, from start to finish of Reagan's appearance, was the emotional high point of the day Monday as he campaigned through the South, trying to break the political hammerlock that President-Carter held on the region four years ago.

Reagan's campaign managers think he has a chance to capture Florida, but they say the race is neck-and-neck with Carter now. Reagan planned to attend a rally in Pensacola today before setting out for stops in Baton Rouge, La., and Springfield, Mo.

In a long day of campaigning, the Republican presidential candidate flew from Baltimore to Knoxville, Tenn., and then to Miami.

"Jimmy Carter has turned his back on the problems you face in the South," Reagan said in Knoxville, criticizing the president's handling of the economy and unemployment.

Combining figures during Carter's term of average mortgage rates, the rate of price increases in food and gasoline, and the unemployment, Reagan created the "family suffering index" to measure the president's performance.

Carter had used a similar gimmick in his 1976 campaign — the "misery index" that combined the inflation rate with the rate unemployment.

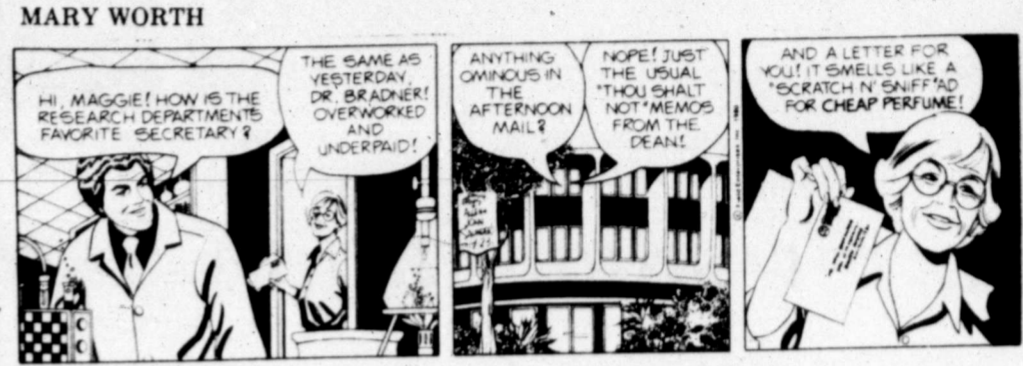

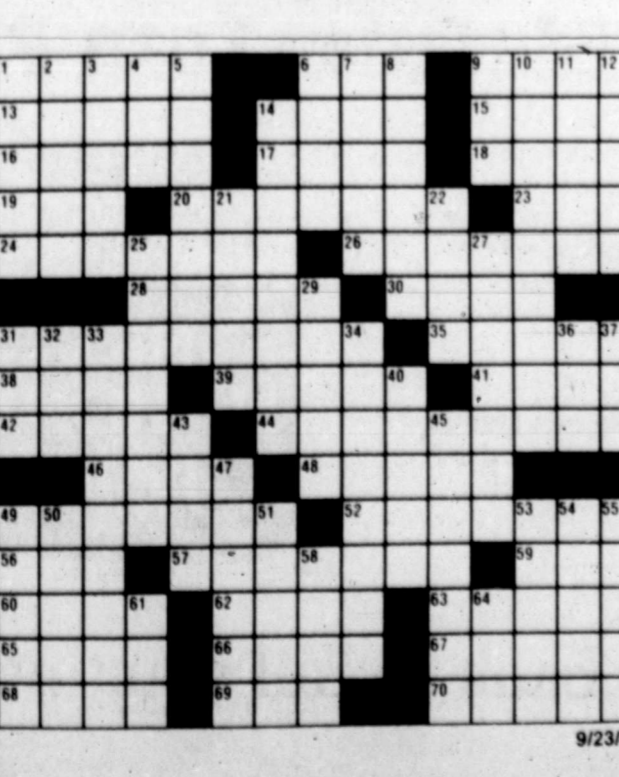

# Warhead to be moved to Texas

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP) — The nine-megaton nuclear warhead that was ejected from a missile silo during an explosion last week will be taken to a government-owned weapons assembly plant in Texas for disassembly or analysis, a federal official says.

The warhead, reportedly slightly dented but undamaged otherwise, was taken Monday from the area of the underground Titan II missile silo near Damascus, Ark., to Little Rock Air Force Base.

Today's Amarillo (Texas) Globe-News, meanwhile, reported that a specially equipped Air Force plane had arrived in Little Rock to transport the warhead to the Pantex plant outside Amarillo.

## Pantex confirms missile shipment

AMARILLO, Texas (AP) — The nuclear warhead damaged in the Titan II missile accident will be disassembled or analyzed at a nuclear weapons plant in this Panhandle city, a Pantex plant official says.

Paul R. Wagner, the ranking Department of Energy official at Pantex, confirmed Monday that the weapon was destined for Pantex, but said he had not been told when it would arrive.

"I have been told... that the damaged warhead from the Titan missile accident will be sent to Pantex for disassembly or analysis," Wagner said.

Meanwhile, the Air Force still would not confirm or deny a nuclear weapon was involved in the weekend accident.

At the devastated Titan II missile silo site in Damascus, Ark., the warhead, apparently contained in one of two canisters labeled "Do Not Drop," was loaded onto a flatbed truck Monday and taken to Little Rock Air Force Base.

Arkansas law enforcement officers followed the truck on the 90-minute trip to the base near Jacksonville, about 12 miles northeast of Little Rock. Two helicopters flew ahead to report traffic conditions.

The weapon in question — carried by the Titan II intercontinental ballistic missile — is the largest in terms of yield in the U.S. arsenal. This conclusion is based on the "throw weight" of the Titan II, or its ability to carry heavy items.

The Titan II is a liquid-fueled rocket with the range of some 7,000 miles.

The blast, which killed a sergeant and injured 21

Administration office at Amarillo International Airport told the newspaper that an Air Force Military Airlift Command transport plane had landed at Little Rock en route to Amarillo.

The New York Times today quoted an unidentified Defense Department official as saying the warhead was slightly dented, but had not leaked radiation.

An explosion on Friday at the silo, which followed a fuel leak, killed one serviceman and injured 21 others.

Although military authorities, following policy, would not even say whether a warhead was involved in the accident, two lead canisters labeled "Do Not Drop" were loaded onto a flatbed truck at the silo site and driven away in a convoy of eight military vehicles escorted by two helicopters.

Before the warhead was moved, technicians opened it and poured in a special oil mixture to neutralize its detonator, composed of high explosives, according to the defense official quoted by the Times.

Meanwhile, Paul R. Wagner, the ranking Department of Energy official at the Pantex nuclear weapons assembly plant near Amarillo,

said, "I have been told... that the damaged warhead from the Titan missile accident will be sent to Pantex for disassembly or analysis. I do not have any other other specifics regarding when."

Pantex, owned and operated by the DOE, has taken in nuclear material from previous military accidents. Nuclear weapons removed from the nation's arsenal are disassembled there.

The blast here occurred about 8 1/2 hours after a workman dropped a wrench socket in the silo and it hit the rocket's first stage, starting a fuel leak, the Air Force said.

Reporters were allowed near the silo on Monday for the first time and noticed an acrid smell in the air. Lt. Col. Tom Cooper said a small amount of fuel vapor continued to leak from the silo, but said it posed no danger.

Gov. Bill Clinton, meanwhile, complained that state and local officials had not received enough information at the time of the blast. Clinton added that he had received assurances from the Air Force that there had been no leakage of radiation in the incident.

There were several reports that a warhead was

blown several hundred feet from the silo, although military officials would not confirm that. However, John Fullerton of the state Office of Emergency Services said an Air Force official had confirmed to him that the warhead had left the silo.

Clinton said Monday that because of the lack of information, officials weren't able to determine what sort of an evacuation to order.

# Brilab defense attorneys get warning

HOUSTON (AP)—U.S. District Judge Robert O'Connor Jr. has given a stern warning to defense attorneys for attempting "to put on trial" the government's key defense witness in the Texas Brilab trial.

And during a late Monday meeting in his Houston courtroom, O'Connor curtly told the attorneys:

"We are not going to get out of here anytime soon if this continues. I am running this court and you are not and don't think you are."

An obviously angry O'Connor made the statement after defense attorneys asked for permission to dig deeper into the relationship between

FBI informant Joseph Hauser and Waco, Texas, insurance executive Bernard Rapoport.

Roy Minton, defending Texas House Speaker Billy Claton, said he believed Hauser was lying to the jury when he told them Rapoport was a close personal friend, and "they should know this."

O'Connor said, "If you want to prove that, then bring Mr. Rapoport as a witness. You are trying the witness."

Minton said he was doing everything possible to shorten the case but that he was afraid to bring Rapoport as a witness in this second week of the trial because the judge might rule it irrelevant.

The judge issued two stern warnings during Monday's cross-examination of Hauser.

First he said, "The witness (Hauser) is not on trial, move along."

And later, when he told attorneys to furnish Hauser with a copy of previous testimony, "We are not conducting a memory test of this witness."

Hauser, twice convicted of bribery and of taking kickbacks in insurance deals, served as an FBI informant in the undercover Brilab investigation that touched almost every section of the nation.

His testimony, and secret tape recordings he

made, led to the June 12 indictment of Speaker Clayton, Austin attorneys Donald Ray and Randall Wood, and L.G. Moore, regional director of the International Operating Engineers Union.

Clayton, Ray and Wood are now on trial before a seven-woman, five-man jury on charges of bribery, conspiracy, racketeering, and extortion.

Moore is to be tried later on the same charges.

During Monday's testimony, Hauser said he had been paying off labor officials since 1965 to get union insurance business.

"Those are the facts of

life. In my experience, nobody in America does any business with union officials without paying for it. No one can be successful without bribery when dealing with labor unions."

The government witness also said he didn't come to Texas "to target" Clayton, but the politician's name first was brought up by Moore.

The jury also listened to tapes in which Moore said he could "cut a deal" with the house speaker.

Moore continued, "I can say, look, Billy, you get this deal and you get this, Okay?"

Hauser: "Beautiful." Moore: "Now he's that kind of guy."

The government has accused Clayton of accepting a \$5,000 bribe from Moore with a promise of an additional \$500,000 to help secure a rich state employee insurance contract for Hauser, who then was posing as a representative of Prudential Insurance Co.

Clayton said he received the money but thought it was a campaign contribution and planned to return it later.

Tapes of the Sept. 20, 1979 meeting between Moore and Hauser also revealed this exchange:

Moore: "I think I can wire that (delete) up...I really do. The Speaker of the House. I'm going to

have breakfast him in the next two weeks. ... He's my friend. I've kept him, you know what I mean, when his ass was in a box and I'd go get one of my guys off his ass or something."

During the meeting, Hauser said, "We could lay 25 to 50 (thousand) on the speaker in two seconds."

Moore then talked about "two guys in Austin", saying, "They know where every wire is."
