The Texas Automobile Beadlight Law requires that every motorist, a the time of regietration, present w
the Tax Collector a headight cer the Tax Collector a headilght cer tiffeste which bas been issued by Teet Station within thirty days the date of registration.
If the car or truck to be regis. tered is not equipped with headlampa, the rogistrant will be permitted to take aflidavit to that effect and this affldavit will take the place of a headlight certificate. Earily testing and registration will help th Test stations and the Tax Collector, and will save time for the motoriat. Motcrista cannot obtain a head light certificate for registration pur poses on a re test. The re test prony time daring the jear, but the certificate preseated for registration must be a "test" certifeate and must be paid for. In other words, headlamps are 'tested' at the be ginning of each year for registrahon purposes, and at this time the regular registration fee of twenty-
five cents wuat be paid. At any ime doring the year following, re-test may be had, free of charge, until the next registration period be. gins.

After the coming pre-registration tests, there will not be another set test until the 1927 registration period begins. Throughout the year, however, a constant check will be made on the headlighting conditio in the various parts of the State,
