Texas proving ground
There's little doubt that either
former Midlander George Bush or
former California Governor Ron-
ald Reagan is discounting the im-
portance of this year's Republi-
can primary in the Lone Star
State.
Both men, vying for the Repub-
lican nomination for president,
have ties to Texas. Both men rec-
ognize the impact of a win - or a
loss - here Saturday.
Bush, who lived in Midland
some years back and who is wide-
ly known throughout the state,
certainnly will bring some momen-
tum with him that he gained last
week in Pennsylvania's Republi-
can primary.
Reagan, on the other hand, has
wide support among Texas Re-
pubticans, evidenced by the
strong support he's received in
the state during past elections.
Reagan is far ahead of Bush in
the number of delegates he claims
he has committed to him. In fact,
following the Pennsylvania loss to
Bush, Reagan said he still does
not believe Bush can overtake
him in the race for the nomina-
tion.
