Endangered sharks to get sanctuary
UNITED NATIONS (AP) The tiny Pacific nation of Palau is creating the world's first shark sanctuary,
a biological hotspot to protect great a biological hotspot to protect great
hammerheads, leopard sharks, oceanic whitetip sharks and more than 130 other species fighting extinction in the Pacific Ocean.
But with only one boat to patrol 240,000 square miles 621,600 square kilometers) of Palau's newly protected
waters - including its exclusive waters - includic zone, or EEZ, that extends 200 miles ( 320 kilometers) from its coastline - enforcement of the new measure could be almost like swimming against the tide.
Palau's president, who is to an-
nounce the news to the United nounce the news to the United
Nations General Assembly on FriNations General Assembly on Fri-
day, acknowledges the difficulty of patrolling ocean waters nearly the size of Texas or France with a single boat. But he hopes others will respect Palauan territorial waters - and that the shark haven inspires more
conservation efforts globally.
"Palau will declare its terri
waters and extendedeconomic zone to be the first officially recognized sanctuary for sharks," Palauan President Johnson Toribiong told the Associate Press in an interview Thursday.
Shark fishing has grown rapid Shark fishing has grown rapidly since the mid-1980,
demand - mainly in China - for shark fin soup, a highly prized symbol of wealth. Because of their long life spans and low fertility rates, sharks are vulnerable to overfishing. Within its EEZ, a nation may regu-
late fisheries and scientific research late fisheries and scientific research and develop other economic efforss.
The U.N.'s Food and Agriculture Organization estimates more than half of highly migratory sharks are overexploited or depleted. Toribiong said a recent flyover by Australian aircraft showed more than 70 vessels fishing Palau's waters, man of them illegally.
