They want to turn the Caribbean territory into a major supplier of primates, much to the dismay of islanders already dealing with a plague of patas monkeys - descendants of lab escapees that run though backyards, stop traffic and destroy crops. can island nation of Mauritius, says the operation will employ at least 50 people and buy fruit from local farmers, an important consideration
