 - Just how rist At the request of Scottish officials, the U.S. government will sort that out as it reviews its ban on haggis, a sort of sausage
made by rolling cooked sheep's made by rolling cooked sheep's
offal - the liver, heart and stuffing it into beef intestine and boiling it.
Not that most Americans have exactly been clamoring for it. But
word that the U.S. Department of word that the U.S. Department of
Agriculture would reconsider its Agriculture would reconsider its
ban - which dates to the U.K.'s mad cow disease scare of the late 1980s - did stir some excitement with Scottish producers. "This is long overdue and I'm
glad the U.S. glad the U.S. authorities are com-
ing to their senses," said master ing to their senses," said master
butcher Neil Watt of Watt the Butcher in Montrose, on the east coast of Scotland. "The haggis you get in the States does not taste like proper haggis." Of course, the lifting of the ban is far from certain. Depart-
ment of Agriculture spokes woman Lindsay Cole said reports that any decision had been made are incorrect. The latest science is being reviewed, but no timetable was set for a decision, she said in
