Google sent out a request for information in search of cities to nominate them to host the company experiment and help deploy the new project,
he said. Cities can be nominated individually, by groups and organizations, or by the local government, but Alavi said CEO believes the best way for Lubbock to gain Google's attention is to be nominated by the club with the support of the university and local government, he said.
