objections. Democratic senators in turn would promise to make a limited number of changes under "budget reconcili ation" rules, which bar flibibusters. Republican and Democratic

## Ancient sex on show in Paris

PARIS (AP) - The latest show at Paris' Quai Branly museum comes with
a warning for visitors:"This exhibition of a warning for visitors: "This exhibition of
Moche ceramics shows sexual acts of an explicit nature."
But the extraordinary and graphic testimonial of the ancient Moche civilization of Peru isn't about physical pleasure procreation, according to the curator.
He says the sexual acts evoke the tuals that accompanied the death of dignitaries, and the human sacrifices that went with them. They tell a story about the power of the elite that he says has parallels with modem life. "Sex, death and sacrifice in the Moche religion," which opened this Eurk and runs until May 2 , brings to ceramics on loan from the Larco Museum in Lima, Peru.
The Moche lived on what is now the northem coast of Peru between the first and eighth centuries. The ancient Andean people belonged too one of the
would be recognized as astate, construct-
ing cities with elaborate monuments and ng cities with elaborate monuments and textiles, metal and ceramics.
Their culture is on display at the anthropological Quai Branly museum, whose recent exhibibs include an exploration of the Teotihuacan people of ancient
Mexico and atribute to Affican literaure and culture. The visitor to the Moche show is
sked to look beyond the graphic nature of the exhibits, such as the outsize penis used for pouring liquids, or the grimac ing woman being forced to perforn oral sex. Some of the acts are disturbing and
