## Raider Park causes Tech, alumni loss

Texas Tech and its alumni association stan to lose as much as $\$ 1.2$ million from leasing th Raider Park parking garage in a deal involvin a number of prominent alumni of the Phi Delta Theta fraternity.
Raider Park, a $\$ 25$ million venture located at 2522 Marsha Sharp Freeway, is a privately owne parking garage held by a limited partnership con trolled by Clayton Isom, a 29 -year-old Phi Delta Theta alumnus from Tech with deep ties to th university and its alumni board. Currently, the lease agreement requires Tech and
the alumni association to pay $\$ 750,000$ a year to lease the alumni association to pay $\$ 750,000$ a year to lease
1,000 parking spaces and 18 RV spaces, which are used by Tech students during the week and attendees at Red Raider football games on the weekends. Only at Red Raider footbal games on the weekends. On
about one-third of the spaces have been leased.

The university and the alumni association The university and the alumni association
have lost $\$ 440,000$ since the deal was signed have lost $\$ 440,000$ since the deal was signed
in December of 2009 . They will likely lose an in December of 2000 . They will likely lose an
additional $\$ 760,000$ in the next several years. The lack of demand, the pricing of parking spots and other shortcomings cited by students - such as location - have resulted in two-thirds of the parking garage not being filled. In the original lease agreement, the alumni
association assumed responsibility for selling association assumed responsibility for selling
the 1,000 parking permits to students. However, the 1,000 parking permits to students. However,
when fewer than 100 student permits were sold, University Parking Services took over the responsibility.
The prices of the parking permits were lowered, which provided affordable parking for students but, at the same time, restricted the Tech, making it impossible to break even.

Alumni association ignored warnings from Red Raider Club, president says By CAROLINE COURTNEY, IOANNA MAKRIS and APRIL CUNNINGHA

The Texas Tech Alumni Association will likely lose $\$ 525,000$ from the Raider Park parking garage lease agreement because of fauly information from a marketing company - a mistake the Red Raider Club warned against, Terry Fuller, president of the Red Raider Club, said.
Fuller said if a donor gives the Red Raider Club $\$ 2,500$ to \$4,000 for a student athletescholarship fund, they become eligible sociation, when projecting revenue from the garage, assumed the $\$ 2,500$ to $\$ 4,000$ spent would go directly toward a parking space. "The Texas Tech Alumni Association became involved in that project with the thought process that it would be a money-

"There was some thought process
that the Red Raider Club actually sold parking places, and that misinformation was presented to the alumni association.' A donor to the university, who wished to remain anonymous, said the association about how the Red Raider Club allocated parking spaces was gored by a powerful coalition of membees, all of whom belong to the Phi Delta Theta fraternity.
The Red Raider Club did not agree agreement because they did not want ouse potential scholarship money or a parking garage. Fuller said if the Red Raider Club had gotten involved, he would have regretted it.
"I find that disgusting," Fuller said. "I cannot live with myself looking in the mirror every morning knowing 1 took
advantage of my university to the tune of half a million dollars a year." He said the misunderstanding led to an enormous fluctuation in the price of the parking spots at Raider Park parking garage. The alumni association, with the thought of being able to sell the sorely disappointed when it sold fewer than 100 spots.
