Reports surfaced after the shooting that Holmes, his hair dyed a reddishorange, had told arresting officerrs he was Batman's sival, the Joker. Authorities declined to confirm that, but fans were quick to note that the Jokers hair 24 -vear-old sitting in court Monday hardly recalled Batman's arch-nemesis. "Clearly, we are influenced by popular culture," said Langley. "The tricky part is quantifying it. There are millions upon millions of influences on us all the time. Still, questions persist about pos-

is - and he's always beend doing that to make himself feel bigger in the world. That could appeal to individuals who want the world to fit around them. For the majority of fans, they don't have
