Romney sweeps Republican nomination Tuesday night

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) - Former
Massachusetts Gov. Mitr Romney Massachusetts Gov. Mitt Romney
swept to the Republican presidential nomination Tuesday night at a storm-delayed national convention, every mention of his name cheered
by delegates eager to propel him into by delegates eager to propel him into a campaign to oust President Barack Obama in tough economic times.
Romney watched on television with his wife, Ann, at a hotel suite across the street from the hall as the convention sealed his hard-won victories in the primaries and caucuses of last winter. To send Romney and ticketmate Paul Ryan into the fall campaign, delegates approved a conservative government calls for tax cuts - not the economy at a time of sluggish growth and 8.3 percent unemployment Polls make the race a close one, to be settled in a string of battleground states where neither Romney nor the president holds a secure advantage. While there was no doubt about Romney's command over the conven-

Texas Rep. Ron Paul, who never won a primary or caucus, drew several dozen delegate votes - precisely how many were not announced from the podium. Earlier, his supporters chanted and booed after the convention adopted rules they opposed, but were
powerless to block, to prevent those powerless to block, to prevent those
votes from being officially registered. "Shame on you," some of his supporters chanted from the floor.
Boehner, presiding over the roll call, made no attempt to have Romney's nomination made by acclamation,
even though Ryan's was a few moeven though
ments later.
The night was Romney's for sure, but some of the loudest cheers were accorded Wisconsin Gov. Scott Walker, a hero among Republicans for fending off a labor-backed recall attempt last spring. Convention plannerss squeezed two days of speeches and ocher convention
business into one after scrapping Monday's scheduled opener because of fears that Isaac would make a direct hit on the Florida Gulf Coast:
That threat fizzled, but it was instantly replaced by another - that Republicans would wind up holding a political celebration at the same time

## Tech football ready for kickoff against Northwestern State

$\qquad$ Anxious.
It is a word being used among the Texas Tech football team to feelings heading into their home opener.
Tech will take the field and begin its 2012 campaign against the Demons of Northwestern State at 6 p.m. Saturday at Jones
AT\&T Stadium. The Demons are a memeber of
the Southland Conference in the Football Championship Subdivision, but Tech quarterback Seth Doege said he is preparing as if it were any other week.
"They might not be as big as we would go against in a Big 12 Conference game," he said. "But
at the same time, I don't think they're going to fear us. I think they're going to come in here and bring some heat."
Even though Tech isn't looking ahead, the disappointment
of missing a bowl game still of missing a bowl game still
does not sit well with the senior quarterback.
"We didn't finish the way we really wanted to (last season),"
Doege said. "We've put in so much time and hard work since that game ended that it's excit-
ing to finally get a chance to prove that we're not that team anymore."
Doege was added to several preseason watch lists after post-
ing a 4,000 -yard season last
year, the eighth best statistically year, the eighth best statistically
among Football Bowl Subdivision quarterbacks. This season, Doege said his main focus is winning games and
the recognition will take care of itself. "I just want to be known as a quarterback that led this team to a Big-12 Championship," he said. "I have some personal goals, but those don't matter to me as much as winning football games here."
The Red Raiders have endured a long offseason that included a new defensive coordinator - the fourth in four years - which means a new system and new concepts for the players to grasp.
Senior safety D.J. Johnson Senior safety D.J. Johnson
said many of the woes with last said many of the woes with last
seasons defense stemmed from seasons defense stemmed from
overthinking. "This year, we've transitioned
from the beginning of camp to from the beginning of camp to
the end of camp," he said. "We the end of camp," he said. "We just trust each other and we're
going to go out there and play going to go out there and play

The Red R abandoned the many different schemes they ran last year and are transitioning into a $4-3$ defense with emphasis on run-stopping.
Johnson said, new defensive Johnson said, new defensive
coordinator Art Kaufman has coordinator Art Kaufman has
already shown confidence in already shown confidence in
Johnson and fellow senior safety Cody Davis by giving them free range to make adjustment calls
on the field.
"I may see something on the
field that coach Kaufman may
not have noticed," he said. "I feel because of the communication, that's going to make the team that much better."
