## Lubbock County confirmed

 third case of West Nile virus Wednes day, but no new cases hasreported as of Thursday. Beckie Brawley, public health coordinator for the City of Lubbock Health Department, said all three people are doing well and recovering. The United States has reported 48 states as of Tuesday 48 states as of Tuesday, according
to the Center for Disease Control. This year, 70 percent of the West Nile cases have been reported in Louisiana, Mississippi, Michigan, Oklahoma, South Dakota and Texas with almost half of the cases being reported in Texas.
According to the Texas Depart-
ment of State Health Services web site, 894 cases of West Nile virus have been confirmed in Texas, resulting in 34 deaths in 2012 as of Thursday. Bell, Bexar the 34 deaths, Andrews, Bell, Bexar, Collin, Concho, Ellis,

Gregg, Hood, McLennan, Montague,
Panola, Travis, Wharton and Williamson counties have one death each. Denton and Harris counties each have two deaths, Tarrant Coun-

has 12 deaths according to the Texas Department of State Health Services on Thursday.
