Mexico finds a few escapees in border prison break

PIEDRASNEGRAS, Mexico (AP) - Officials said Tuesday they have found three inmates thought to have
escaped through a tunnel a a a northerm escaped through a tunnel at a northerm Mexico border prison, lowering the
number of escaped prisoners to 129 . number of escaped prisoners to 129 .
Three female inmates were found hiding in a prison visiting area, Jorge Luis Moran, the public safety secretary of the northern border state of Coahuila, told the television network Televisa. Federal police units and Mexican troops, including 70 members of an elite
military special forces unit were searching for inmates who fled the prison in Piedras Negras, a city across the border from Eagle Pass, Texas. They escaped Monday through a tunnel 21 feet long and 4 feet in diameter and then cut their way through a chain link barrier. Moran later said the jailbreak ap-
peared to have been orchestrated by the hyperviolent Zetas drug cartel. "We assume that they organized it," he said. He said some of the inmates might have been forced to take part in the jailbreak as a way to swell the ranks of the Zetas, who have been fighting a bloody turf battle in Coah
Sinaloa cartel.
The directo
ployes of the state prison have been detained for an investigation.
President Felipe Calderon called the jailbreak "deplorable" in a statement posted on his Twitter account long-running dispute between federal and state authorities, writing that "the vulnerability of state law enforcement institutions must be corrected."
Collusion between guards and drug gangs has played a role in past escapes, and federal authorities have been pushing to have all state and municipal
police and law enforcement officials police and law enforcement officials
submit to background and anti-drug checks, as well as vetting for possible links to organized crime.
But state authorities have been dragging their feet. On Monday, federal Interior Secretary Alejandro Poire said that only 180,000 of the country's
430,000 city and state police officers had been vetted and checked and that about 65,000 of those tested had failed the tests.
A failure rate of about one-third of officers has been a constant in the
testing program, which is supposed
to conclude with all officers vetted by early 2013 . That goal now appears unreachable, and the question remains of what will be done with the officers
who failed. All are supposed to befired hut Mexican labor laws and a shortage but Mexican labor laws and a shortage
of recruits to replace them makes it an arduous process.
For example, federal police have vet-
red all of their officers, ted all of their officers, and many have gone through background checks more than once, but many of those who fail are still on the 36,000 -member force. took office in December 2006, about 2,045 federal officers have failed periodic vetting and anti-drug tests, and 302 of them have been fired. About 600 others are involved in the lengthy internal-affairs procedure that could
lead to peoople losing thei jobs lead to people losing their jobs. Moran complained that Coahuilas process may have been responsible for process may have been responsible for the Piedras Negras prison when the jailbreak occurred. Only 12 guards were on duty to watch 734 inmates, after
some guards and officials were some guards and officials were dismissed
after failing background checks, he said. after failing background checks, he said.

be in the prisons have been dismissed, and that resulted in the fact that there weren't more people on duty," Moran

Topless photos ruling: 1st battle in privacy war

LONDON (AP) - Prince

Jeweler settles suit against ex-Duke player

DALLAS (AP)—Former Duke
basketball player Lance Thomas has settled a lawsuit that accused him of failing to pay nearly \(\$ 68,000\) for jewelry purchased while he was part
of the Blue Devils team that won the 2010 national championship. Mike Bowers, the attorney Rafaello \& Co., said his client had agreed to settle the lawsuit against Thomas stemming from the nearly \(\$ 100,000\) in diamond jewelry the player purchased in the middle of
the \(2009-2010\) season. The Dallas the 2009-2010 season. The Dallas
attorney said the terms are confidential, and he reiterated his client's unwillingness to discuss the matter with the NCAA, which is seeking details of the transaction. "This is a private matter between my client and MM. Thomas, and thats
where it stands," Bowers said Tuesday where Jockson, Duke's associat athletic director for media relations and public affairs, said the settlement doesn't change an ongoing inquiry involving the university and
 he said. The lawsuit, filed in January in Austin, Texas, said Thomas owed \(\$ 67,800\) for five pieces of jewelry he
purchased at a cost of \(\$ 97,800\). The invoice, dated Dec, 21, 2009, indi cates that Thomas made a \(\$ 30,000\) down payment and agreed to pay the
balance in 15 days. balance in 15 days. Thomas started 39 , games at forward for Duke in 2009-2010, his
senior season, including the 61-59 victory over Butler in the NCAA championship game. The lawsuit, which wasn't disclosed publicly until The Associated Press reported it earlier this
month, has raised questions about Thomas e ligibility that season and whether Duke's national title could be affected. NCAA rules prohibit athletes from receiving benefits that aren't available to the student body as a whole.

QB Vince Young out of the game, now out of money

DALLAS (AP) - Six years after entering the NFL as the third player
taken in the draft, Vince Young find taken il the dratt, Vince Young finds
himself without a team and with just a fraction of the money he received from a contract that guaranteed him \(\$ 26\) million.
The question is, where did it all go? In an increasingly caustic war of
words, attorneys have been aroving for months over whether Young is an out-of-control spender who puth himself deeply in the hole or simply a victim of inexperienced advisers, one of whom was his own uncle.
Either way, the quarterback whose
future seemed unlimied after he fuuture seemed ullimited after he led
Texas to a Rose Bowl victory in 2006 is now back home in Houston and in tenuous financial condition.
"I would just say that Vince needs a job," said Trey Doleaal, Young's attomey, when asked to give a general assessment of his client's finances.
Young was cut by the Buffalo Bills,
his third NFL team in Aust his shird NFL team, in August. He was
trying to make the Bills sa a backup, the same role he filled with the Philadelphia Eagles in 2011.
The fall has been a dizzying one for
he player who twice made the Pro Bowl the player who twice made the Pro Bowl with the Tennessee Titans. Young sent out a tweet thanking the Bills and their
fans after he was released but hasnt spoken to the media since. He declined arequest tobe interviewed for this story Even in pro sports, where tales of squandered wealth abound, Young' plightis " "pretty dramatic," said Kenneth Shropshire, a professorat the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School of
