a polygamist sect had settled in a remote corner of Texas, many in the town of Eldorado were nervous.

whom he described as his "spiritual wives." The 56 -year-old is serving a life prison term but has continued to try to lead his roughly 10,00 followers from behind bars. Doran said things shave been
