

Witnesses Say Explosions Preceded Airplane Crash

ROY, N.M. (AP) - The Air the crash of a 2,000-mile-per-Force security shroud around hour spy plane in northeast New Mexico was punctured only a

little Wednesday by witnesses. Rancher Albert Mitchell Jr. and other witnesses said they first heard two explosions at what they termed an unusually high altitude and then saw the SR71 supersonic, twin-jet reconnaissance aircraft crash Tuesday near the Mitchell ranch 30 miles east of Roy.

They said they saw the two pilots floating earthward about four minutes after hearing the explosions. Test pilot James T. Zwayer, Lancaster, Calif, was found dead in his parachuteejection seat. Pilot Bill Weaver, Northridge, Calif. survived with minor injuries.

There was no statement from Air Force investigation team headed by Brig. Gen. C. D. Stewart of Norton Air Force Base, Calif. Civilians were kept at a distance

Zwayer and Weaver, test pilots for Lockheed Aircraft Corp. which built the aircraft, were or a test flight out of Edwards AFB. Calif.

Mitchell said he and two ranch hands were branding colts in a corral when they heard the explosions. They saw the black aircraft in a spiraling. flaming descent. Then they saw

Mitchell said he dropped his branding iron and ran toward the ranch hangar and helicopter He said he found Weaver about one mile from the ranch hanger and Zwaver's body about one mile from where Weaver landed.

The rancher said both pilots were in pressurized suits and their faces seemed somewhat swoilen after the high-altitude descent. He said he had to cut the shrouds and straps holding the men in their parachute-ejection seats. Zwayer's face was smeared with blood, Mitchell

Mitchell quoted Weaver as saying "Everything was going fine and suddenly whoof." He said his hands nearly were frozen during the fall. Mitchell







USSR Trawlers 'Harrassing'

U.S. Warships

ABOARD THE USS TICON-DEROGA in the South China Sea (UPI) - Soviet trawlers packed with highly sensitive electronic equipment are keeping close tabs on the U.S. 7th Fleet and occasionally "harrassing" American warships, it was disclosed Wednesday.

The trawlers come and go, apparently relieving each other at irregular intervals, and return to their bases with any intelligence information they may have gathered.

Outskirt Slums Call For Legislation

A CRITICAL need for new and strengthened legislation giving municipalities and counties broad powers to enforce reasonable health, building, safety and welfare standards in "fringe communities" is pointed up in Reporter Kenneth May's Avalanche-Journal story on the "instant slum."

These "new" communities have become

These "new" communities have become a growing problem not just for Lubbock and Lubbock County but for a number of Texas cities in which efforts are underway to eliminate slum areas. The slums simply pop up outside city limits where the residents, landowners and landlords can take advantage of weak state laws which permit only a few sanitation controls.

As it is now, cities have only one means of protecting themselves, and that is annexation. New legis in Austin as the outskirt slums are moved from one the effort.

location to another, places a terrific burden on city taxpayers. And the lack of effective county powers means that there is a shifting "no man's land" in which health and fire hazards, junk accumulations and unsupervised livestock keeping can thrive.

A cure could well be a top project for Lubbock County's delegation to the 60th Legislature. Aspirants for the seats should be thinking about the problem now, and in their campaigns should make their views known to their prospective constituents. In the past, Lubbock's legislators have demonstrated the value of teamwork in protecting and advancing area interests.

In this project, they would have the opportunity to benefit the entire State as well. New legislation is the answer, and our men in Austin should be among the leaders in the effort.

Arlington No Place For A Traitor

THE WIDOW of Robert G. Thompson is doing her best to see that her husband's principal life's work bears as much unpleas ant fruit as possible.

Thompson's compelling purpose was to attempt to overthrow the Government by violent means. For this he was convicted in 1949 and received a seven-year sentence, including four years for jumping bail. He was released from prison in 1958 and died last October 15.

Now, as an insult to the nation and to its honored heroes, she has arranged for Communist Thompson's ashes to be buried in Arlington National Cemetery next Monday. This she is able to do because he served in World War II in the Pacific, winning the Distinguished Service Cross for heroism Military officials confirm the shocking fact that Arlington regulations permit interment of a convicted enemy of his country.

Mrs. Thompson has said that she prefers that traditional patriotic honors be omitted. Thus she would forego the rifle salute, be cause her husband abhorred the firing of guns by U.S. servicemen in Viet Nam. What she means is that Thompson had no real localty to his country. He participated in the Spanish Civil War on the Communist supported side, and fought in World War II when Russia was allied with the U.S. But when Russia became an enemy he, too, became an enemy

'Kickback' Promoted

THE PROPOSAL that the Federal Government return a percentage of the income tax to local communities is receiving a big push in Michigan cities, notably Ann Arbor and Dearborn.

Arguments for the "kickback" are ably presented in an editorial published in the Dearborn Guide. The newspaper points out "The plan calls for an automatic return to local communities of a certain portion of Federal income taxes for use by individual city governments in a manner they deem best. This would remove much of the Federal strings from funds that come from the cities in the first place."

It would reduce much of the red tape involved in obtaining Federal funds and thus speed up much needed local projects, many of which have received high priority from city leaders who are in much better position to evaluate them than are Washington's bureaucrats.

A rate of \$10 per person has been suggested as for the rebate. This, for example, would give Lubbock a yearly fund of \$1,600,000. It seems that Michigan municipalities view the plan as a logical extension of that State's system under which cities automatically receive proportionate shares of State sales and gasoline taxes as well as from the intangibles tax and liquor permits

In view of the coming year's record Federal Budget, accompanied by income, corporate and excise tax pressures, the outlook for favorable action on the rebate by Congress in this session is none too bright. The idea, however, is too appealing to be abandoned even temporarily by its proponents.

WASHINGTON If logic were the controlling influence today in formulating the military policy of the United States in Viet Nam, there wouldn't be any doubt about the next move now that the "truce" is over and the "peace offensive" has fallen on deaf ears.

But the logic which calls not only for a resumption of bombing raids but for an intensification beyond what has been done before is uppealatable, politically. The word "politically"

The word "politically" covers international and diplomatic aspects as well as domestic considerations. Evidence mounts that many people inside and outside of Congress—are doing a lot of wishful thinking and feel that there is some miraculous way to attain a quick ending of the conflict if only the other major governments would get together to quell the warfare, just as happened in the Congo a few years ago with the aid and supervision of the United Nations.

FOR CERTAINLY the Viet Nam war could be stopped in a week if the U.N. had the backing of the Soviet Union and various Communist satellites which have an influence with the Red Chinese government in Peking.

Obviously the "peace offensive" by President Johnson had a worthy purpose—to show the rest of the world that the United States really wants peace—but it would have been surprising if the North Vietnamese had responded to such a move instituted by one government, especially their principal adversary.

THE UNITED States, however, is on the spot militarily. Before the truce it conducted a "limited bombing" of North Viet Nam. Is the alternative then to be "unlimited bombing," or is there a middle course? Certainly it would not be surprising to see the United States step up its bombing and then, before taking any extreme measures, it could decide to await the reaction of the North Vietnamese as well as the Soviet Union.

One thing seems clear—the Moscow regime isn't anxious to see an enlarged war in which most assuredly Russia would become involved if only to supply financial and military help to the North Vietnamese beyond anything undertaken heretofore. This is an expense the Com-

Meanwhile, inside the United States it appears that the Viet Nam war is becoming more and more unpopular every day and that what the group of members of Congress said recently on their return from Southeast Asia has conveyed an impression of frustration—a puzzlement over what to do next. For ther's considerable worry about how public opinion would react to an intensified war and an increase to 300,000 or even 500,000 American troops in Viet Nam.

It is possible, of course, for the United States to let the Viet Nam war drag on for years while furnishing a limited number of men and fighting a defensive war. Military men think this would be wasteful of American lives and that the smallest loss would be incurred by intensifying the war now even if it means destroying a substantial part of Hanoi itself. Warning would be given of forthcoming raids so that the civilian population could withdraw temporarily. The objective of the bombing would be to destroy supply lines and bases periodically, while mobilizing most of the American troops along the seacoasts to protect the largest part of the South Vietnamese people against guerrilia ttacks.

MOST OF THE military men both here and in Saigon feel, however, that any decisions made will be political in the sense that they will be geared to the possibility of an international peace conference of some kind. The initiative is expected to come from some of the so-called

"non-aligned" powers.

Basically the United States wants to get out of the war honorably and with the rest of the world convinced that this country will come to the aid of small nations whenever they are attacked by aggressors as was the case in South Korea and Viet Nam.

FOR DIPLOMATIC purposes the United States has made its point. A mechanism that might bring about an armistice and a peace conference is available through the United Nations, The

key to this lies in Moseow and not Peking.

For, once the Soviets determine that the war in Viet Nam must come to an end, the Red Chinese will have no choice but to go along with that decision and let the peace conference develop the best compromise possible.

'Money War' Heats Up

WASHINGTON- President Johnson's proposed speed-up in payment of corporate income taxes has unwittingly escalated his shadow war with William McChesney Martin over control of the economy.

As Chairman of the Federal Reserve Board (America's central bank), Martin wields extraordinary power over the economy exclusive of the President. As a Wall Street conservative, Martin is more frightened by a little inflation than by an end to the long economic expansion. The fact that the Fed, led by Martin, raised interest rates last December in defiance of Mi. Johnson, showed clearly that Mr. Johnson has not brought Bill Martin under control.

THIS PROBLEM is intensified by the new corporate tax payment, which will require big companies to pay taxes on a current instead of the present delayed basis (bringing in an extra \$3 billion this year to finance the Viet Nam war). Preferring a speed-up to increased corporate tax rates, business leaders haven't squawked.

But contrary to what the Treasury tells Congress, many expansion-minded corporations don't have a cookie jar full of money for the speeded tax payments.

Bond Used For 'Bait'



WASHINGTON—Julian Bond's experience with Georgia's House of Representatives was another example of that curious twist in the American psyche which so often permits both sides in a political dispute to look silly. Bond should be forced to do the sixth grade over again, and the men who barred him from a seat in the House should copy the Bill of Rights 100 times.

I do not know whether Bond carries bonafides as either a poet or a pacifist, but I would not vote for this 25-year-old Negro to sit in any legislature of mine because he is not very bright. I prefer a candidate who possesses both good taste and an understanding of the facts of political life.

AS A PRIVATE citizen, Bond had a perfect right to endorse a sleazy statement issued by a curiously Commie-loving outfit known as the Student Nonviolent Co-ordinating Committee (SNCC) which denounced U.S. "aggression" in Viet Nam and encouraged draft-dodging. But as a potential legislator in race-conscious Georgia, Bond should have known that endorsement of such tawdry and perhaps treasonous drivel properly would raise questions about his capacity to help make the state's laws.

No politician is completely his own man, beseiged as he is by lobbyists for private interests, but Bond permitted SNCC to use him to his own political detriment. As publicity director for SNCC, Bond apparently had been so brain-washed by this gaggle of untidy anarchists that he had stopped thinking—if, indeed, he ever indulged in this exercise. SNCC was looking for a martyr and trapped Bond into filling that role.

MOREOVER, THE question of treason still hangs over those utterances which have become so popular with the civil rights movement's extreme left. The Constitution defines treason as giving aid and comfort to the nation's enemies, and when Bond endorsed the U.S. "aggression" charge and said he admired the courage of draft card burners he was not making the Reds unhappy. On this record, Bond would find it difficult to legislate in what the House members' oath describes as "the interest and prosperity" of Georgia.

That brings us to the fatuousness displayed by the Georgia House in voting to bar Bond by 184-12. If Bond was the bait in the SNCC's trap, the House gobbled it up and thereby became anathema to all free citizens who occasionally give errant thought to due process.

BOND WAS NOT accused of any crime—although this could come later, both in his case and in the cases of some other political beatniks. No shred of evidence yet has been presented to support a charge of treason, however. Bond was punished for expressing an unpopular opinion, a violation by the House of the Constitutional guarantees of free apeech even as interpreted by the State of Georgia. The SNCC statement was typically irresponsible and vulgarly unpatriotic, but no court had ruled it was criminal.

Personally. I agree with the Georgia House that Bond is not the stuff of which a good legislator is made. But the voters elected him, just as they elect so many clowns and crooks all over the United States, and Georgia had no legal right to reject him. At this writing, I do not know what the future holds for Bond, but the first step should be taken by his pa, an education dean at Atlanta University. What Bond needs most at this point is a long and vigorous session in the woodshed.

IF THE corporations finance their new fax payments at the expense of expansion plans, this could end the Kennedy-Johnson boom that has avoided recession for more than five years. Ac-

cordingly, these corporations will be out to bor-

row money if they can.

Whether or not they can depends on Martin's Federal Reserve Board which, in the opinion of President Johnson's most intimate advisers, today maintains an unnecessarily tight money policy.

ONE GOOD indicator of this is the current "free reserves" of banks-money held in excess of money loaned out. Latest figures show a negative free reserve of \$180 million. That means banks have \$180 million more in loans outstanding than money in reserve, creating a dangerously short money supply in the opinion of Johnson men.

men, Even if the Fed does make more credit available, it will be costly. The New York bankers, who have far more influence on Martin than does the President, want last month's Johnson-opposed rate increase followed soon by another increase and in a few months by still another thereore.

CORPORATIONS THAT want to expand probably would borrow at any rate, no matter how high. Moreover, with the heavy proportion of the Federal debt in short-term securities, higher interest rates further increase the cost of servicing the Federal debt and the budget deficit. Thus, the net impact might be inflationary exactly the opposite of what the President intends.

If he wants to, Mr. Johnson can cut through his problems with the Fed on Jan. 31. On that day, Vice Chairman C. Canby Balderston, of the Reserve Board, a Martin ally, will retire. The President can fill that vacancy and gain full control of the nation's economic policy.

BUT HE MAY not. In confidential talks with his closest advisers, Mr. Johnson has discussed a dozen possibilities for Balderston without making his choice. Significantly, he has made clear he doesn't want an easy money expansionist who would so change monetary policy as to trigger Martin's resignation.

Because, if Martin resigns in a huff, the loss of business confidence could have unpleasant results of unpredictable severity. Indeed, Mr. Johnson is so far frum wishing an open break with Martin, that, in conversations with conservative businessmen, he has made the incredible statement that he actually favored the interest rate hike last month and was on record against it only for public consumption. In fact, he was much disturbed by the Fed's action.

THE CHANCES are the President will replace Balderston with a middle-of-the-road man who will back Martin sometimes and oppose him other times. But indecision might delay his selection so far beyond Jan. 31 that Balderston would remain on the board while important decisions were made. In any event, Mr. Johnson's present inclination is not to assume absolute control of the End from Martin.

trol of the Fed from Martin.

The reason: because of the Fed's legal independence, Martin has become such a sacred cow with the business community that to downgrade him risks the alienation of business.

The root of the problem is really not Lyndon Johnson's but the law's. Why should a Presidential appointee be given statutory power to challenge the President in so basic an area of policy as the money system?

U.S. 'Life' Is Disgrace



WHAT, OH, WHAT can we do to put the heart and fire and punch of our great country out where it belongs in the boots and bare arms of our Americans moving in the dark, where life is a knife, while the Dow Jones averages hit 1.000?

'Dry' Mississippi

MISSISSIPPI IS the last "dry" state in the Union. It also is the only one with an expert on alcoholism working full time in the public school system, and one of the few with a school of alcoholic studies at the university level.

Just how badly officially "dry" Mississippi may need these and related precautions in the field of alcohol education is indicated by the fact that Mississippians last year consumed an average of half a gallon of the hard stuff for every man, woman and child in the state—this out of "illegal" whiskey on which taxes had been paid. The Lord knows what the consumption record may be on really illegal filegal liquor, which is to say, liquor on which there exist no tax records at all, state or federal.

These updated consumption statistics were reported by the Associated Press in connection with yet another bid to repeal the state's prohibition law during the legislative session presently under way at Jackson. There is the barest hope that, this time, repeal will succeed, for local authorities in Jackson and Hinds County have put the lid on the free-style drinking in which the state's law-givers historically have tended to wallow while voting to continue in being both "prohibition" and the state tax on a commodity that is, officially, non-existent -according to the state's own statute book.

Mississippi's \$3.50 a gallon "black market" tax on illegal whiskey which is a dollar higher than Arkansas' gallonage rate on the legal product is a testimonial to hypocrisy that may be as unique among the states as its nominal "dry" status in itself.

Hypocrisy, practiced long enough, can come to be an end in itself, and we are sure that there are persons in influential places in Mississippi who no longer greately care how much the people of Mississippi drink or how or in what kind of place, but who want to keep the state's liquor laws the way they are for the sheer pervisity of the thing. There are, of course other people among those who drink who actually prefer to do their drinking in a pool hall men's room. (Arkansas Gazette)
