## Commissioners hear monitor system plan

A representative from Lifeline Systems met with the County Commissioners Monday, March 12, to discuss the Personal Emergency Response Systems (PERS). The cost and the way the system works was explained to the commissioners. These systems are monitoring services in which equipment connected to an individual's home telephone transmits an alarm for help to a response center.

A report from the Texas Justice Court Training Center stating that Cecil Kemp, of Bronte, Precinct 2, had successfully completed the training course, was reviewed and accepted.

Commissioner Lockett motioned to approve the Affirmative

Action Policy. This policy must be approved to receive Revenue Sharing monies. It is a policy requiring the county to provide equal employment and opportunities at all levels of County Government.

Placing a phone at the show barn was discussed. Commissioner Newby moved to table the discussion until further information could be obtained on the cost.

The provisions of the Davis-Bacon Act were discussed. This act governs and regulates money received from the government and all provisions have to be complied with to receive Revenue Sharing money.

Wednesday morning, Palmer remained in Shannon's intensive care unit in critical condition, said a Shannon nursing supervisor.

No charges have been filed in connection to the accident.

## RL sales tax figures down

Robert Lee sales tax figures show a slight decrease over 1983 collections for the period ending February 27, 1984. The figures released by Comptroller of Public Accounts Bob Bullock's office show payments for this period to be \$1,521.66 compared to \$1,784.34 last year. The total 1984 payment to date is \$9,127.21 up slightly from the 1983 figure of \$8,699.84 reflecting a 4.91% increase to date.

According to the City Sales and Use Allocation Summary, there was a 3.12% increase for Coke County, with Bronte and Robert Lee's total payments to date being \$14,635.44 compared to 1983 payments of \$14,192.16.

# Fishing on the increase at Oak Creek Lake

A lot of bass tournaments are being fished, but many of the best fish are being caught by fisherman not fishing with a bass club. Even though the water level is down some from where it's been the past two or three years, it's now at a more normal level and ready to offer some excellent fishing.

Just take a look at the size of some of the larger bass caught over the weekend. Gim McClaren of Lubbock fished with the Clovis, N.M. Bass Club and took all the marbles with the largest bass to be caught so far this year, his largest ever and real lunker going 8 pounds 7 ozs. Walter Graham of Abilene got two on Sunday that anybody would be proud to put on a stringer. The largest tipped the scales at 7 pounds 11 ozs. and the second one at 6 pounds 10 oz. Bass clubs were here from Clovis, Snyder, Haskell and Ballinger. There were a lot of bass caught, with most ranging from 1 to 4 lbs.

There are crappie being caught that are worth going after. A good number of these fish are in the 1 1/2 pound class with stringers of fifteen to thirty fish rather common.

Harold Kennedy of the lake baited a trotline with twenty-

eight shad, for that's all he had at the time. If he could catch fish as he did there would be little need in ever baiting any more hooks than this. He took off five channel cat with a total weight of 14 pounds.

The water temperature is on the rise, 52 degrees at one foot over the deep water and as high as 58 in the creeks. If you are going, it's time to go looking for that ol' trophy bass.

## Soil Conservation Service News

The Coke County Soil and Water Conservation District Directors held their regular monthly meeting last week.

Informational material was ordered for those churches in the district who were interested in the observance of Soil Stewardship Week. Plans were also made to attend the West Texas Association meeting at St. Lawrence later in the month.

Problems in maintaining proper grazing use in Great Plains Conservation Program contracts were discussed. Several producers will need to make adjustments in stocking rates very soon to stay in compliance on their contracts.

The directors also worked in the conservation district information and educational booth at the San Angelo Stock Show.

Directors attending the meeting were: Joe Rawlings, Royce

Fancher, Horace Scott, Finnell Smith, and Wilbern Millican. Others attending were Eph Cummins of the Soil Conservation Service, and Barney Jefferson of the State Soil and Water Conservation Board.

Those producers who plan to seed any kind of a range forage grass this spring need to be making plans to get the job done. The optimum time to seed grass in this area is during March and April. Seeding earlier than this is still very good. But seeding grass later in the spring and on into June is most likely doomed to failure.

Seeding the grass early gives the seed a chance to catch any of the early rains that might happen to fall. The seedling roots have a chance to become better established before the stress periods of the usually dry summers.

Notice is given that COLORADO RIVER MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT, P.O. Box 869, Big Spring, Texas 79721-0869, applicant, seeks to amend its Certificate of Adjudication No. 14-1008 pursuant to Section 11.122, Texas Water Code, and Rules 156.04.10.004-.006 (31 TAC Section 347.24-347.26).

Certificate of Adjudication No. 14-1008 authorizes the applicant to maintain a dam on the Colorado River in Coke County creating Lake E. V. Spence with a capacity of not to exceed 488,760 acre-feet and to maintain an off-channel reservoir (referred to as Barber Reservoir) in Mitchell County with a capacity of not to exceed 2500 acre-feet of water diverted from a designated point on the Colorado River. The certificate authorizes the municipal use of not to exceed 40,000 acre-feet of water per annum diverted from Lake E.V. Spence, the industrial use of not to exceed 2000 acre-feet of water per annum diverted from Lake E.V. Spence and the mining use of not to exceed 8000 acre-feet of water per annum diverted from Lake E.V. Spence (of which the District may divert not to exceed 6000 acre-feet of water per annum from the authorized diversion point on the Colorado River to Barber Reservoir for mining use). The certificate includes a special condition that indicates diversion from the Colorado River to Barber Reservoir can take place only when the chloride content equals or exceeds 500 PPM.

The certificate authorizes three diversion points on Lake E.V. Spence and indicates that the combined maximum diversion rate at all four points of diversion will not exceed 156 cfs. The time priority of the certificate is August 17, 1964.

The certificate includes a special condition concerning use of water from Lake E.V. Spence in combination with use from the District's Lake J.B. Thomas (Adj. Certificate No. 14-1002) and special conditions designed to protect and honor downstream senior and superior water rights.

The applicant seeks to amend Certificate of Adjudication No. 14-1008 as follows:

1. To authorize construction of a channel dam forming a 3.4 acre-foot capacity reservoir on Beals Creek, tributary of Colorado River, Colorado River Basin, in Howard County, about 5 miles east of Big Spring;

2. To authorize a diversion point on the reservoir created by the Beals Creek Channel dam that is S 82° 52' E, 2910 feet from the NE corner of the O.M. Brack Survey, Abstract No. 1518, Howard County, with a diversion rate of 25 cfs;

3. To authorize construction of a dam forming an 8538 acre-foot capacity reservoir on Red Draw, tributary of Beals Creek, about 1.5 miles south of the proposed channel dam on Beals Creek;

4. To authorize use of the water diverted at the proposed Beals Creek Diversion facility and stored in the proposed Red Draw Reservoir to satisfy up to 6000 acre-feet per annum of the existing allocation of 8000 acre-feet per annum for mining purposes;

5. In addition to the presently authorized diversion points on Lake E.V. Spence, to authorize use of the water diverted at either the existing Colorado River diversion point in Mitchell County or the proposed Beals Creek diversion facility and stored in either the existing Barber Reservoir or the proposed Red Draw Reservoir to satisfy the existing allocation of 2000 acre-feet per annum for industrial purposes; and

6. To authorize use of 50 acre-feet of water from Beals Creek for construction purposes during construction of the proposed Beals Creek and Red Draw facilities.

The proposed channel dam on Beals Creek will be in T&P RR Co. Survey No. 7, Abstract No. 107, Howard County, with Station 1+00 on the center line of the dam being S 81° 57' E, 2932 feet from the aforesaid Brack Survey corner. The proposed dam on Red Draw will be in T&P RR Co. Survey No. 13, Abstract No. 158, Howard County, with Station 26+01 on the centerline of the dam to be S 09° 42' E, 2628 feet from the NE corner of T&P RR Co. Survey No. 13.
