Mr. Stephens is president of the corporation which owns the Town and Country

convenience store chain, located in the community.

Extension Agents Debra Reber and Tommy Antilley reports were heard and accepted by the court.

Bills were approved for payment and court adjourned.

## Historical Commission meets

During the Coke County Historical Commission's September meeting, it was announced that County Commissioners had combined the Historical and Museum Committees as one group to better serve the project.

Plans are being made to open the old jail as a museum in the near future. The Committees emphasized the need for items to display, either to be donated or on a loan basis. Only a few items remain there from the previous museum project attempt. Repairs have been made to the building so that care and security will be afforded all displays.

A Coke County Archive will also be established there. The term archive encompasses public documents, business records, newspapers, written memoirs, letters, diaries, photographs, oral history tapes and transcripts, and any other type of historical data. An archival collection should be designed to preserve valuable records and make

them available to researchers.

The public is urged to contribute any historically important papers to this Archive. Items such as obituaries which will later become history or research for families later are useful. ## Jerry Thomason attends County Treasurers' Conference

Coke County Treasurer, Jerry Thomason of Robert Lee along with some 112 other county treasurers attended the 36th Annual Texas County Treasurers' Conference in Amarillo, Sept. 17-20. President Vesta Leonard of Gatesville, Coryell Co. Treasurer, called the conference to order. Among the speakers were Sen. Bill Sarpalius of Canyon; J. Robert Brown, executive director of the Texas County and District Retirement System; Norman Troy, Jefferson Co. Commissioner; District Judge Bobby L. Cummings of the 52nd Judicial District in Coryell Co.; and Doug Manning, president of In-Sight Books, Inc. of Hereford. Informative discussions pertaining to the duties and responsibilities of county treasurers were also an important part of the session.

The Hon. Warren G. Harding of Brownsboro, former

State Treasurer, served as master of ceremonies for the annual CTAT banquet at which Geneva Carter of Weatherford, Parker County Treasurer, was installed as president for the ensuing year.

At the conference in Amarillo, more than 200 county treasurers were awarded certificates for the completion of 20 hours of classroom training mandated by House Bill 570, which the County Treasurers' Association was instrumental in passing in 1983. In compliance with the continuing education bill, county treasurers received training in finance, management, governmental accounting, and computerization when they attended classes in April at Texas A&M University in cooperation with the V.G. Young Institute for County Government.

## Wildcats whop Steers with ball-control offense; Steers host Hornets next

There's nothing to say about the outcome of this game. We got whopped, physically and mentally! They controlled the ball so much of the game that the Steers had little opportunity to do much. They didn't make big chunks of yardage, but they made 3 and 4 yds. at a whack to run the clock in their favor.

### 1ST QUARTER

The Steers kicked off to start the ballgame with W.V. returning to the 30 where they fumbled and Michael Wilson recovered at that point. The Steers moved to the 24 where they were held on downs and W.V. took over. They make a 1st at the 35, but the Steers then held and they punt to the S.19 with a return to the 30. W.V. then punts to the W.V. 29. The Steers hold this time and they punt to the S.32. W.V. holds for little gain and we punt to W.V. 16 when they fumble and Kevin Johnson recovers. The Steers take advantage real quick as Jim Bob Jacobs takes a pitch around the end and goes in for the score. The extras fail and the Steers are off to a 6 to 0 lead. The Steers kick off to the W.V. 25 with a return to the W.V. 40. The Wildcats then fumble again and Doug Bell recovers at the W.V. 39. But W.V. holds on downs as the quarter ends.

### 2ND QUARTER

Water Valley then makes the most of it with a running and passing attack that makes them 4-1st downs to drive in for the score. They kick their extra point and they now lead 7 to 6. W.V. kicks off with the Steers returning to the W.V. 45.

The Steers then fumble the ball with W.V. recover-

ing at the W.V. 30. W.V. makes a 1st down at their 41, but the Steers then hold and they punt to the S.27. The Steers make a 1st at the S.44, but then they have to punt with W.V. getting the ball at their own 2 yd. line. W.V. makes 2-1st downs to their 26 as the 1st half ends.

### 3RD QUARTER

The Steers receive the 2nd half kickoff with a return to the S.40. W.V. holds on downs at the S.49 and W.V. takes advantage again as they make 3-1st downs to the Steer 6 in line. From there they score again and kick their extra point and they now lead 14 to 6. They kick off to the Steers and after a penalty the Steers have the ball at the 15 yd. line. The Steers lose to the S.4 and then on the next play the Steers are tackled in the end zone for a safety which builds the lead to 16 to 6 for the Wildcats. The Steers then kick to the W.V. 48 on the safety free kick and W.V. has it again. The Steers then hold and W.V. punts to the S.18 as the quarter ends.

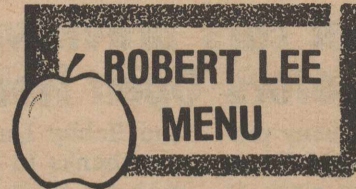
### 4TH QUARTER

The Steers were minus the services of three key players, Greg Grim, Bobby Boone, and John Hinnard, last Friday night. Hopefully, their return will strengthen the team for remaining contests.

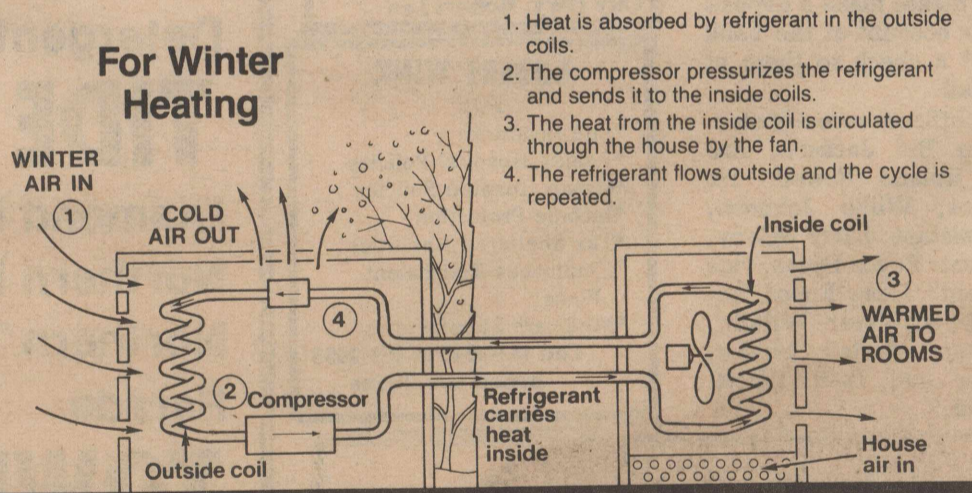

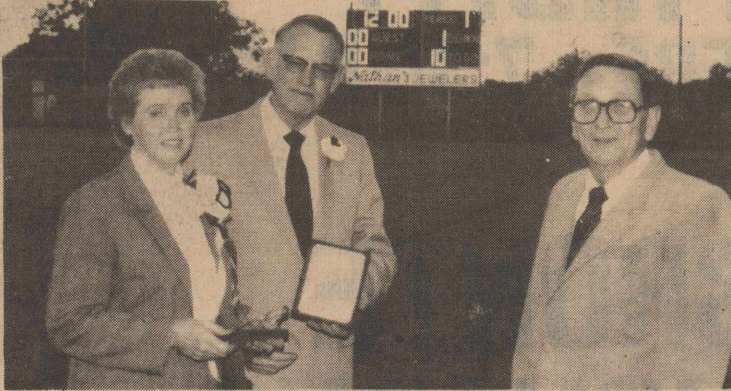

## Spencer named state winner in 4-H Santa Fe program

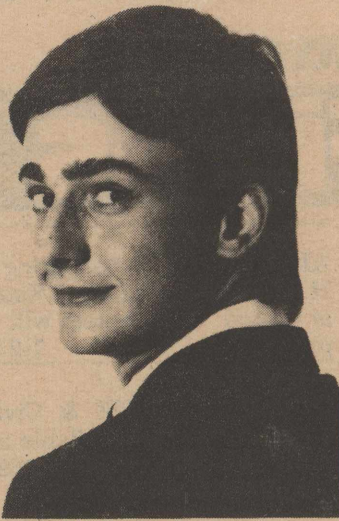

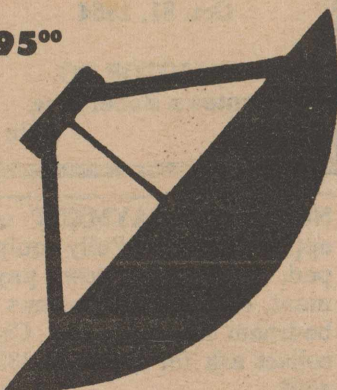

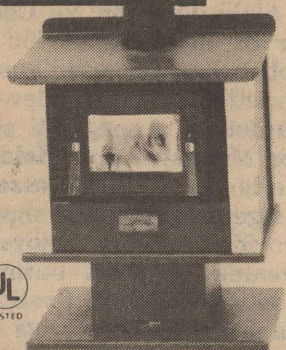
