Steers to face state-ranked Roscoe

And the band played "Who'd A Thought It?" It's Thanksgiving and the Robert Lee Steers are still playing football. Sports forecasters have downplayed the Steers all year and they are still in the middle of things.

The Steers, by virtue of their 26-20 victory over Goldthwaite in Coleman last Friday night, advance to the bi-district play-offs this week. They will enjoy the home field advantage against Roscoe, gained by a coin flip, at 7:30 PM on Friday night.

The team played good solid football against a tough, confident Goldthwaite team last week and came from behind to win the game. The barnburner thriller was enjoyed by a good hometown crowd as well as coaches and players from the 8-A Zone Robert Lee was representing. Within the

zone, the Lometa Hornets stung Eden for a 27-9 loss the same night.

The Associated Press ranks Roscoe #7 in the state among Class A teams. The Plowboys are certainly formidable foes; last week they gained 442 total yards during their 34-0 rout of Wilson. Their Kevin Reed amassed 227 yards in just 17 carries. According to Robert Lee Coach Nelson Coulter, the Plowboy's junior quarterback led the team to the state finals as a freshman. The club is big and strong, a traditional trait for Roscoe, are able to throw the ball, although they've not had to much, and utilize the Houston veer option with great success, he said. The veer is an explosive offense with a number of different looks, Coulter explained.

Coulter stated the Steers

sustained no serious injuries last week and indicate they are ready to play again. He said, "It will take our best

effort for this game. We will pit our quickness against their size. Our kids have given no indication they've had enough

football for the season and want to turn it over to Roscoe. I expect us to give a good effort and see what happens."



Opening weekend fizzles as weather affects hunting

The opening weekend of the 1984 deer and turkey hunting season fizzled in Coke County as well as most of the surrounding areas. Cool, rainy weather apparently kept game bedded down and hunters either inside or stuck in muddy pastures.

On Monday night, Robert Lee's only deer storage, Skinner's Grocery & Station, reported only 9 hanging deer carcasses and no turkeys. The best buck seen was a nice 8 point buck taken west of Robert Lee by Craig Bessent of Coahoma.

Thrif-Tee Food Store in Bronte, who also do processing, reported only 2 deer in

storage.

Most landowners or agents report low deer kills with those taken being in good shape overall but with less than average antler development. A good number of turkeys have been harvested, most being adult birds with few young ones observed.

The weekend rains, although a curse to hunters, was a boon to area farmers and ranchers. Blackwell, Bronte, and Robert Lee all received from 1 to 1½ inches of rain. Recently planted small grains and young weeds and grasses were needing added moisture when showers began before daylight Saturday morning.

Lady Horns defeat Wink; win State Championship

The Lady Longhorns capped off their successful 30-3 season with the ultimate prize - a state volleyball championship. This was the third state championship won by Bronte in nine appearances at the state U.I.L. tournament in Austin. Bronte met Wink in the finals Saturday morning. It seems the Wildcats caught the Lady Horns napping during the first game and brushed by them 15-6, but after that it was Bronte's game all the way as they dominated the last two games by scores of 15-5 and 15-8.

The first game in Class A of the tournament was played Friday morning against Miles. This game seems of little consequence now after winning the "big" one, but that two-game match paved the way for Bronte to reach the finals. The first game with the Lady Bull Dogs of Miles resulted in a fairly close score of 15-10, but in the second game the girls from Bronte blew by them 15-1.

Natalie Dunnam, proud mentor of the Lady Longhorns, said the girls were to be commended for working hard and earning this honor. She had much praise for her girls' performances. She stated that Becky Morrow was outstand-

ing in the second game against Wink. Her dinks helped turn the game around. Although Melanie Cooper is small in stature, she really came through against the larger girls at the net, according to the coach. The players for Bronte made key blocks and contained Wink's best player. Connie Badgett played her best game of the season against Miles and contributed greatly to that game.

Beverly Robinson, Lesa Dyess and Stefani Brooks joined three girls from Wink in being selected All-Tournament. Their outstanding performances earned them this recognition.

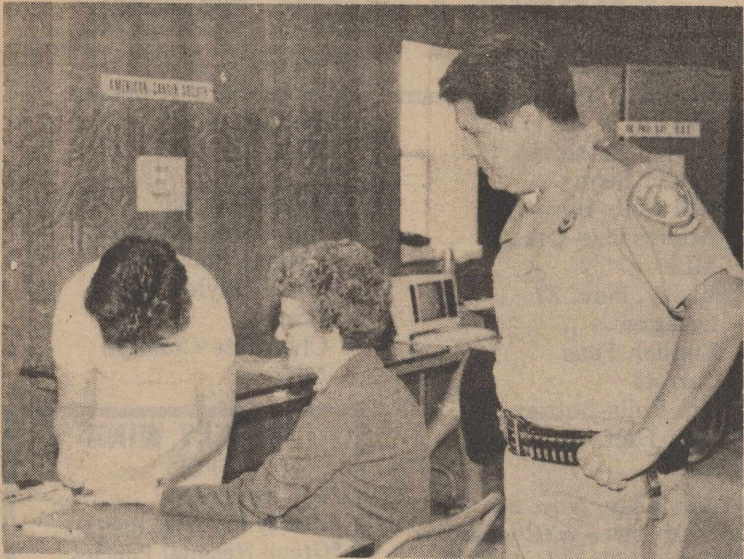

Ninety attend Health Fair

Ninety Coke County residents attended the Health Fair held last Friday, November 16. These people took advantage of the free screenings that were offered, as well as information from exhibits.

Screenings included blood pressure by West Coke County EMS; blood typing and donations by United Blood Services; oral cancer by Dr. Phil Ray, D.D.S.; cancer risk profile by the American Cancer Society; hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia by the West Coke County Hospital; diabetes-blood, skin cancer, height, weight, and anemia by Texas Department of Health, Region IV; hearing by Beltone Hearing Aid Service; and Diabetes-urine by Dr. Terry Pulse, M.D. Several of these screenings resulted in physician referrals. Referrals were made when abnormally

high or low results were found in the testing. Some of the participants were unaware that they had a condition needing medical attention.

The Health Fair was sponsored by the Coke County Extension Office, Texas Department of Health, Region IV, Robert Lee Senior Citizens, and the Coke County Extension Homemakers.

Steers come back in 2nd half to upset the Eagles; face Plowboys here tonight

Hot Dog! More gravy for the Steers. And what do the big time sports writers and forecasters have? They eat crow. Shoot, I knew all along that we would win. You can be confident, but when you get cocky as the Steers competition Friday night, it was only a matter of time before the hogs did them in. Condition and discipline was very evident in the last half of this playoff game. The Steers don't have to be named personally for this victory because they know what they did, and that's the most important thing. Someone has to score the touchdowns and someone has to get up and open the holes. Although the first quarter looked bleak for the Steers, they hung in there and showed what they are made of. I could go on and on, but someone might want to run an ad in the paper. Anyhow, when the smoke cleared the scoreboard read, the Steers by a 26-20 tally.

1ST QUARTER

The Steers received the opening kickoff with Grim returning it to the 50, but a penalty to start the bad things off, brought it back to the S.19. And then the Steers fumble at the S.21 and G. takes over. They make a 1st at the one and then they score with hardly any time gone. The extra fail and they lead 6 to 0. G. kicks off and the Steers return it to the S.21. The Steers make a 1st at the S.39 and another at the G.48. Then G. holds and the S. punt to the G.4. G. makes a 1st at their 14, but the S. hold and they punt to the S.40. The Steers then

make a 1st at the E.35. Then on 4th down the Steers fake the punt and Rasco throws a pass to Kevin Johnson who runs to the G. 4 yd. line. But the Steers miscue again and fumble at the 2 yd. line as the quarter ends.

2ND QUARTER

G. makes a 1st at their 17, but Bell, Wilson, Jameson, Skipworth, Phil Stephens and Co. hold and they punt to the S.20 with a return to the S.48. The Steers can't move and they punt to the E.15. G. makes 2-1st downs to their 46, then the Steers hold again and they punt to the S.23. Then they halt the Steers and they punt to the G.26. Then the Eagles move again on 2-1st downs and a 39 yd. pass and run to score again. They kick their extras and it is now 13 to 0. G. kicks off to the endzone and the Steers get it at the 20. The Steers then get a 1st on a pass to Torres and 2-more to the G.25. Then Grim sees red, and crashes and bruises to the endzone for a Steer TD behind Hinnard and Wilson.

The extras are good and the score is cut to 13 to 7. with 26 seconds left. The Steers kickoff and with the ball at the G.35 the 1st half ends.

3RD QUARTER

G. receives the 2nd half kickoff and return to their 30 yd. line. The Steers then hold and G. punts to the S.30. The Steers make a 1st at the S.42. But the Steers gamble on 4th down and fail and G. takes over at the G.49. Then G. drives again on 3-1st downs to the 18 and from there they score again and kick the extras to lead 20 to 7. G. kicks off to the S.5

with Grim returning to the S.48. Then from the E.47, Grim shows his stuff again and dodges and out races the defense for another TD. Boone kicks the extras again and the score is 20 to 14. Then the Steers pull a little sneaky on an onside kick and Johnson recovers it at the G.45 as the 3rd quarter ends.

4TH QUARTER

G. holds at that point and the S. punt to the E.30. G. makes a 1st at their 41, but the Steers then hold and G. punts to the S.17. Then on 1st down, Grim goes through another big hole and goes 83 yards for another TD. The extras are blocked and the score is now tied 20 to 20. The Steers kick off to the G.15 with the stop made by Randy Stephens, Wayne Harlin and Mike Sanchez at the E.33.

The Steers hold at the G.38 and they punt to the S.36. Then the Steers put it to them as they drive for 3-1st downs to the G.16. Then from the 12, Garringer crashes in for the final TD with about 2 min. left on the clock. The extra fail, but the Steers lead 26 to 20. The Steers kickoff to the endzone and they return it to their 7. They get a 1st at their 25. Then the pass defense of Roberts, Jacobs covering deep and the defensive hogs putting the rush on the passer, held G. for the victory.

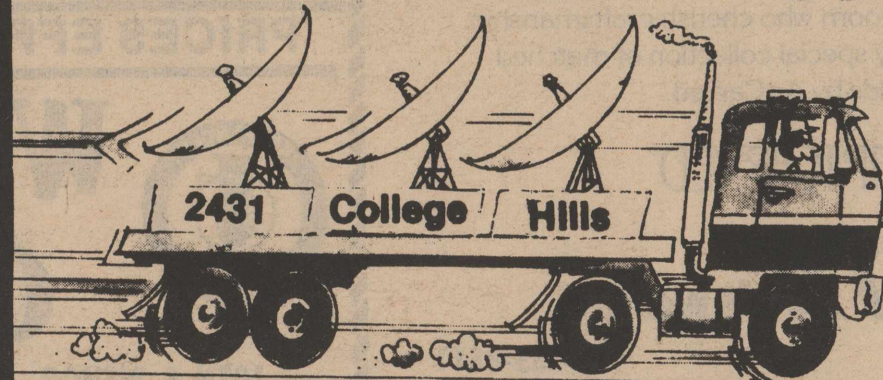

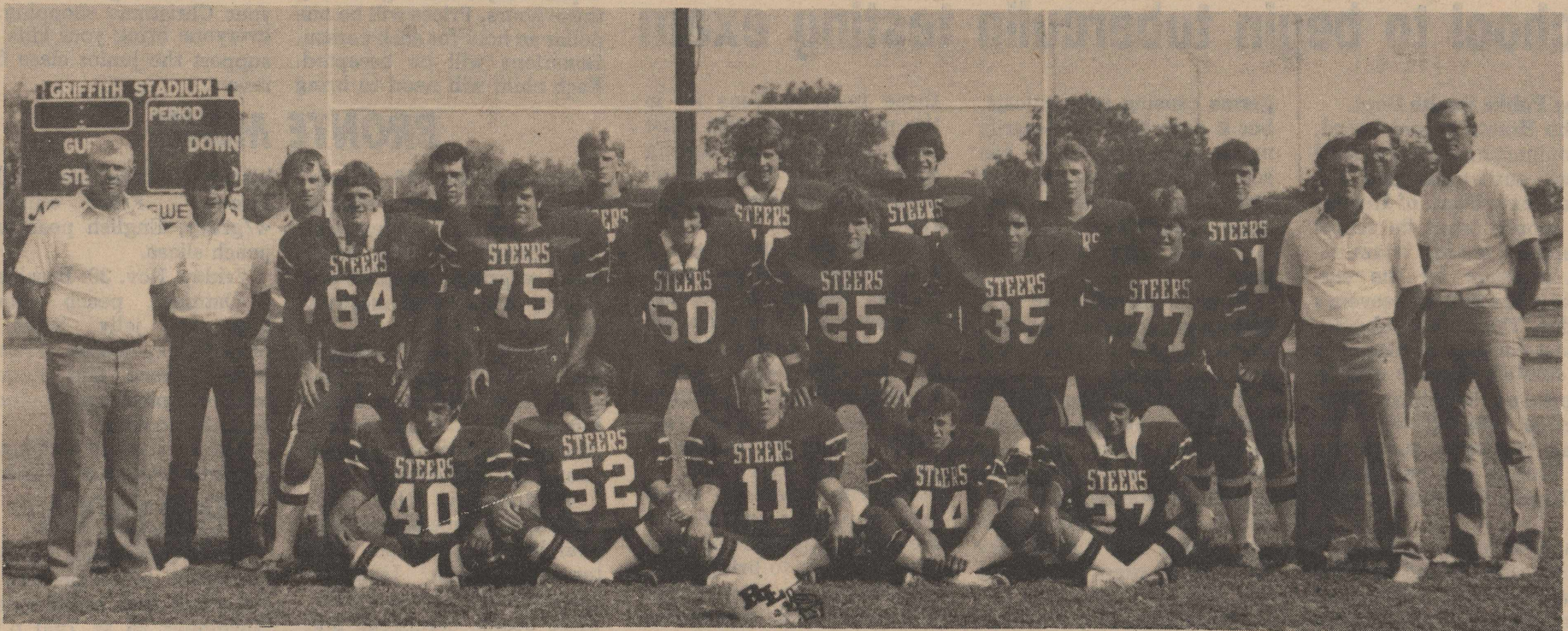

BRONTE SCHOOL NEWS

School to begin tuberculin testing exam

by Public Health Dept.
The Bronte school board, in conjunction with the local health authorities and the Texas State Dept. of Health, will soon conduct its school tuberculin testing examination program for the students in the first and seventh grades. The simple tuberculin test consists of placing a test solution into the skin to determine whether your child is infected with the germs that cause tuberculosis. Testing will be done at the Bronte Community Center.

In most cases the result will be negative and you will know that your child has been infected with these germs. If the test is positive, it will indicate that your child has been infected with the

germs causing tuberculosis, but it does NOT necessarily mean that your child has active tuberculosis. If your child has a positive test, other examinations, including, chest X-ray, are necessary.

Your cooperation in this testing program is important to the health of your child and your family.

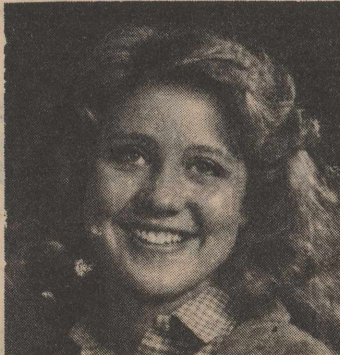
Texas law requires that all children entering school must show proof that they have been immunized for diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, measles, mumps, polio, rubella and T.B. if they are a first time student at this school.

The school will not have an immunization clinic this year. The school will not be responsible for taking care of

these immunizations as in the past. The parents must be responsible for making sure that your child has all their state required immunizations.

The Texas Department of Public Health and the Public Health Region 4 Nursing Personnel from San Angelo will conduct another Immunization Clinic on Monday, November 26 at the Community Center in Bronte for children from two months of age on up. This clinic is being conducted to assist you as parents in meeting the state requirements who were not able to bring their children to the first Clinic that was held September 27th.

Hours for the Clinic are: 12:00 Noon to 5:00 p.m.

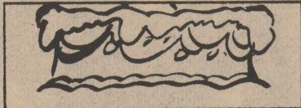

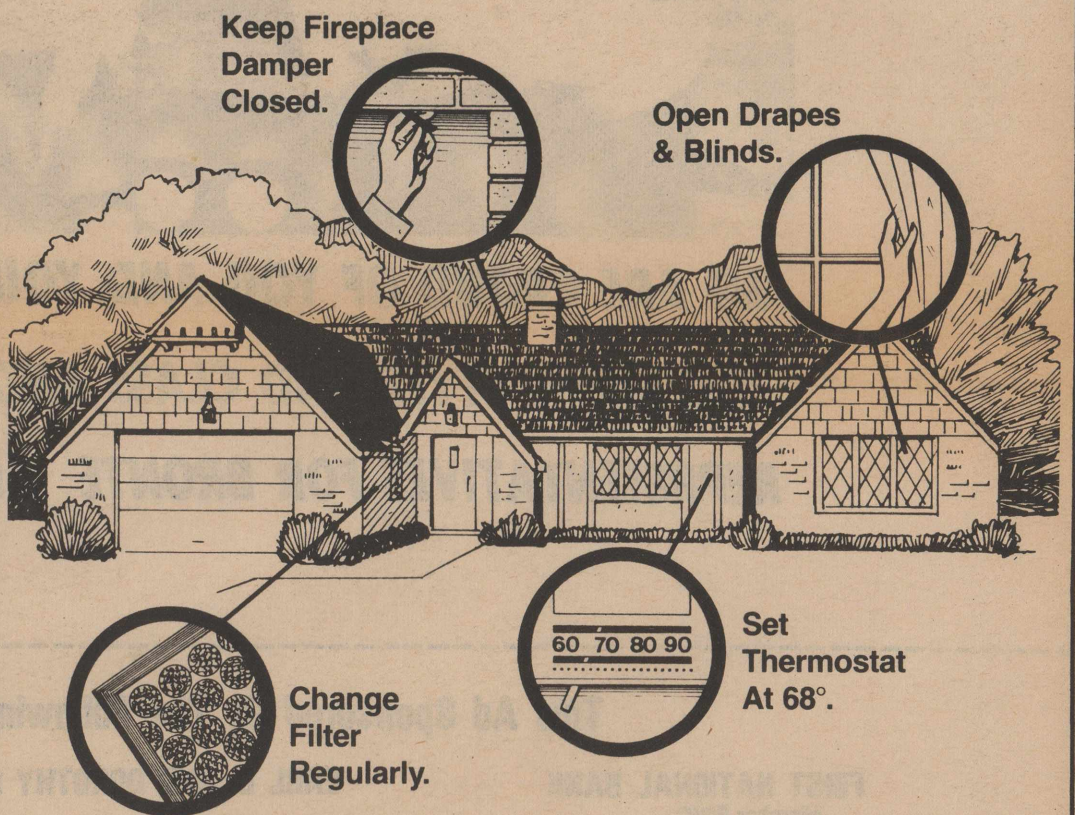
