

Eagles outlast Steers


Two Sterling City Varsity teams converged on Robert Lee Tuesday evening, Dec. 18, for a pair of basketball contests.

Bronte Varsity girls were winners of the Championship trophy after sweeping all three of their games last week in the Robert Lee Invitational Tournament.

Robert Lee girls placed second in their tourney as they were defeated by Bronte 43-27. Third went to Water Valley and Consolation to Miles.

Becky Morrow led the scoring with 15 points for the Lady Horns in their first win over Water Valley, 39-27. Beverly Robinson made 11 points with 6 steals; Carol Reyes, 5; Lesa Dyess, 4 with 6 rebounds; Connie Badgett, 4 with 9 rebounds, Stefani Brooks made 5 assists.

In the second game, Bronte scored 58 points and Irion County 41. Robinson 20 points, 8 rebounds, 7 assists; Morrow, 16 points, 10 rebounds; Badgett, 10 points, 8 rebounds; Dyess, 6 points; Brooks, 4 points, 6 rebounds; Reyes, 2 points.

The Robert Lee girls trounced Christoval 54-31 in the first round. A wide range of scorers contributed to the effort. They were: Missy Grim, 12; Jana Gartman, 12:

Lee Ann Molinar, 10; Tracy Pearson, 6; Rachel Metcalf, 4; Carol Longoria, 3; Lin Long, 1.

In the second round of games Robert Lee girls bested Miles 45-33. Gartman counted for 14, Grim 11, Molinar, 8, Long 6, Longoria 4, and Metcalf 2.


On Friday night against Forsan, the Dogies had a 24-15 finish. Scoring was spread between Herring 9, Cody Anthony 6, Ray 5,

Reducing the Risk of Stroke

Stroke is the third leading cause of death in the United States. A stroke can occur when an artery supplying blood to a part of the brain is blocked or ruptured. Fatrich plaque, blood clots and cell debris carried by the bloodstream can all cause stroke. More than 1.7 million Americans have survived strokes and many of them live with serious handicaps. Stroke affects mainly older people, more women than men, more blacks than whites. So older black women have the highest risk.


What about your risks? Age is the strongest one. With each successive year, the risk becomes greater until past the fifties, when it becomes a considerable likelihood.



Another Key Factor High blood pressure, even when it is only slightly elevated, is a serious risk. "There's no question that controlling high blood pressure lowers an individual's risk of stroke," says O.M. Reinmuth, M.D., chairman of AHA's Council on Stroke. Physicians usually become concerned when blood pressure reaches a reading of 160 systolic (pumping pressure) over 90 diastolic (resting pressure), he says.

USE CAUTION IN HOLIDAY LIVESTOCK MARKETING

"Caution" should probably be the watchword for livestock producers with regard to marketing during the approaching holiday season.

The demand for beef generally declines during the holiday season as consumers eat more turkey and ham. Also, supplies of livestock tend to become erratic in the last few weeks of the year. A few days off around the holidays usually stimulates some extra livestock movements to the sales market. Yet, because of lighter demand, there may not be as many buyers around.

Producers thinking about marketing some livestock in the next few weeks should consider the following:

-Many livestock auction markets are closed during the holiday weeks. Before loading out stock for shipment to a market, check if it is operating that day.

-Since many markets are closed during the holidays, market news reports are often discontinued or abbreviated over these weeks, making price information



-Kosher traditions also affect the demand for cattle. This is especially true during non-slaughtering, feasting or fasting Kosher holidays. For example, Hanukka begins on Dec. 19 and there will be eight days of feasting.

-Both Christmas and New Year's Day fall on a Tuesday this year. Normally that's quite a heavy slaughtering day of the week, so the demand for slaughter livestock may be affected greatly by the holidays this year.

-Livestock prices also are influenced by the holidays. Generally, price strength, as we move into these holiday weeks, yields to price stability until this period is over.

-The holidays, and the traditions that surround them, have a big impact on the amount of money available for spending on meat. Christmas presents, family trips and other holiday expenditures take top priority during this time of year.

The bottom line, then, is for producers to proceed with caution as far as livestock marketing is concerned during the holiday season.







KEEP POINSETTIAS GROWING Thanks to concentrated breeding and selection, the traditional Christmas poinsettias is a hardy plant that can easily be preserved and enjoyed for Christmases to come.

Poinsettias, with their vividly colored leaves (bracts) and golden-yellow flowers, make excellent gift plants for the holiday season. They are now available in colors ranging from the traditional scarlet to white, pink and even variegated.

There are several suggestions for keeping poinsettias healthy and beautiful indoors during the holiday season.

Room temperature should never exceed 72 degrees F. in the day and 60 degrees at night to prolong the bright color of the bracts. Poinsettias should not be subjected to any sudden changes in temperature or any drafts or excess heat, as from appliances, radiators and ventilating ducts.

Place the plants in a room with light sufficient to read fine print. Keep them out of the way of traffic, children and pets.


Water poinsettias thoroughly when the soil is dry to the touch and drain off excess water. Put the plant in a water-proof container to protect furniture.

When bracts fade, poinsettias can be grown as a foliage plant. Cut back the plant to 8 inches and place it out of doors when temperatures warm. However, make sure the plant is not exposed to temperatures below 50 degrees at night.

Return the poinsettia to a room for direct light six to eight hours daily, keeping night temperatures between 60 to 70 degrees. For reflowering next winter, keep the plant away from artificial light at night after Oct. 1.



DIRTY CHIMNEYS CAN **CAUSE FIRES--** Chimneys with heavy creosote deposits are a leading cause of home fires, so an annual chimney inspection and clean-up is in order, notes a safety engineer with the Texas Agricultural Extension Serfice, **Texas A&M University Sys**tem. Creosote is produced when wood burns. It collects on the inside walls of the chimney and is highly flammable. Once ignited, creosote can burn at temperatures up to 3,000 degrees F. and can be pulled out of the chimney by a strong upward draft and onto the roof. Since chimney cleaning is messy and requires special tools, the job might best be handled by a professional chimney sweep.

SS changes must be reported

If you receive an SSI check or if you receive an SSI check for someone else as their payee, you must report any changes in your living arrangements or their living arrangements. It is very important that you report these changes promptly. In order to avoid being assessed a penalty, any change should be reported by the tenth of the month following the month of the change.

Some changes you should report as soon as possible area:

--If you move or change your mailing address; --If there is a change in

your household;

(a) Notify us if you and your husband or wife have separated or if you have begun to live together again.
(b) If a parent of a child

who receives SSI leaves or returns to the household. (c) If you move into some-

one else's house or out of someone else's home.

(d) If you begin living with others and share in household expenses; or there are any changes in the amount you or others contribute to the household.

(e) Let us know if you were paying rent and either no longer paying rent or paying a lesser amount.

(f) Let us know if the number of people who live with you changes.

--If you enter or leave an institution - hospital, nursing home, jail, etc.;

--If a child in your care that receives SSI enters the School of Deaf or Blind or any children's colony or leaves your care;

--If you plan to leave the United States and are to be gone over 30 days;

--If you marry or your marriage ends or if a child in your care marries.

Any of these changes can be reported by phone. Call your San Angelo Social Security Office at 949-7426. This list of changes does not cover every change that may affect your check; so, if you have any questions or doubts, call the Social Security Office.

Christmas trees can trigger asthma
