## Filing deadline nears for elections

Filing deadlines for candidates in the city, school, and hospital elections are rapidly approaching, in Robert Lee, as well as Bronte.

In the Robert Lee School Board of Trustees race, the terms of incumbents Mary Herring, Donnie Robertson, and Gaylon Pitcock are up, and to date, no one has filed for these vacancies.

Four places on the Bronte School Board are up for election this year, with the terms of the following members expiring: Andra Arrott, Wayne Arrott, Larry Spivey, and Ronnie Sims. All four incumbents have refiled, including one additional candidate, Lisa Dunn Glenn.

In the Robert Lee City

Election, those with terms expiring are Jody Rodriguez, F.W. (Pete) Prentice, and J.A. Dunklin. All have filed for re-election. Bascom Chesney has also filed. Remaining members of the city government are Robert D. Vaughan, Mayor, and Alice Beaty and Wilson Bryan, Councilmembers.

In the Bronte City Elections, two places are up for election. Dorris Saunders and Corky Collins have both filed for reelection to these two places. To date, no one else has filed for either of these two places.

Regarding the Hospital District Elections, the terms of Mary Glenn and Stover Taylor are expiring in the

East Coke District race. Mary Glenn has refiled, and Stover Taylor is undecided as yet, with no other candidates filing to date.

In the West Coke Hospital elections, the terms of Dale Wojtek and Richard Johnson are up this year. To date, no one has filed in this election. Anyone interested is asked to pick up a form at the hospital administration office.

As to deadlines, the final deadline for filing in each of these elections, including the city, school, and hospital races is thirty days prior to the elections, or March 6, 1985.

## Bronte, Robert Lee boys end year as champs after successful season

The Bronte and Robert Lee boys basketball teams closed the door on this year's very successful season Tuesday night, as each team was defeated in the area playoffs.

The Bronte Longhorns, outright District 27-A winners after a play-off with Robert Lee, trampled Lohn last Friday night by a score of 76-45, on the strength of a 29 point game by David Phillips, coupled with 20 points worth of help from teammate Blain McGinnis.

Tuesday night's area play-off was a close match all the way, but the Hornets from Aspermont held off the Horns by shooting 14 out of 15 free throws in the final quarter, to win the area contest 70-65.

Robert Lee's Waterloo came at the hands of Eula in the area play-offs Tuesday night. To qualify for the area contest, the Steers had used a strong second-half performance to defeat Mozelle at Ballinger on Friday night by the score of 46-37.

The Steers had trailed in this bi-district contest, with the first half score ending up 23-19 favoring Mozelle. But in the second half, Greg Grim and Bobby Boone led

the Steer scoring with 14 and 12 points, respectively, to overcome the Mustangs.

The Eula Pirates pulled away from the Steers late in the game Tuesday night, and ended Robert Lee's successful season by a 52-39 margin.

So ends county basketball for another very successful season for both the Bronte and Robert Lee boys and

girls teams. The Bronte boys and girls ended up as the district winners, with the lads and lasses from Robert Lee the runners-up, and in the play-offs, all four squads finish the 1985 season as Bi-District Champions.

## Court passes resolution establishing water district

A public hearing was held for the creation of The Coke County Underground Water Conservation District on February 25 at 7 p.m. in the Coke County Courthouse.

The group reviewed the proposed act as prepared by their legal counsel. Discussions and questions concerning several sections of the act resulted in a better understanding of the proposal.

Following the public hearing, the Steering Committee met to determine action to be taken on the proposal. The committee unanimously agreed that an underground water conservation district

for Coke County is desirable and needed. The Steering Committee presented their report and order to the Coke County Commissioners Court for Action.

The Coke County Commissioners Court met and reviewed the available material pertaining to an underground water district for the county. Following the reading of the pertinent material, a resolution was passed by the court endorsing the creation of a water district for the county. The following directors were appointed: Royce Lee, Chairman; Arch Mathers, Horace Scott, Otis Smith, and Billy Tounget.

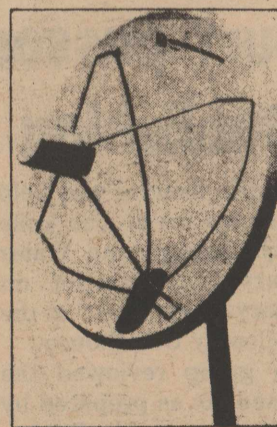

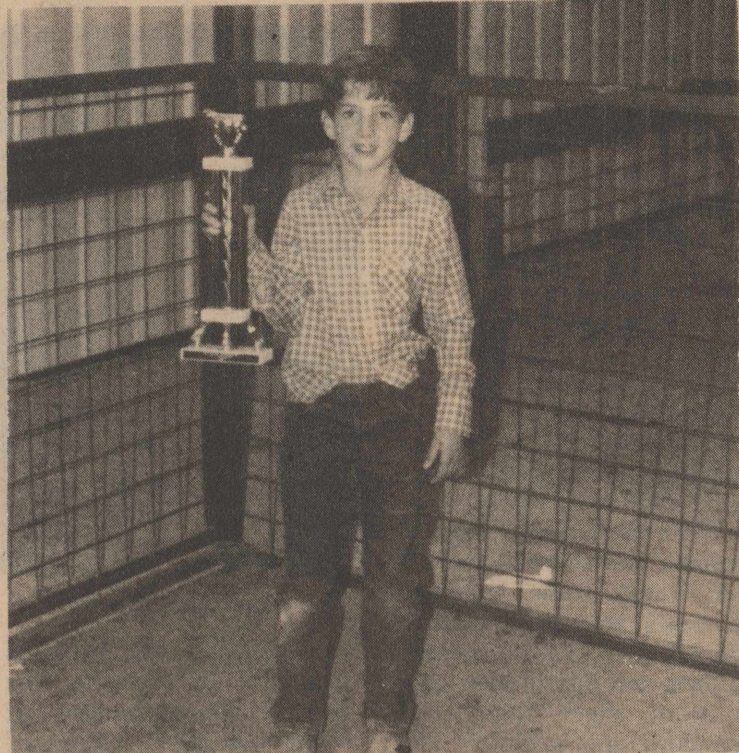

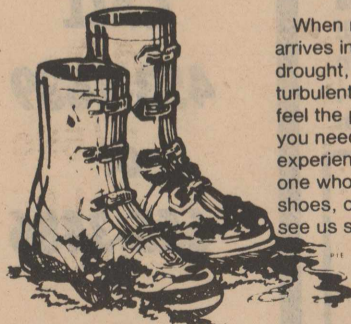

## Restocking orders taken

The Coke County Soil and Water Conservation District is currently accepting fingerling orders for pond restocking. The district announces that the following prices are now in effect per hundred: 4-6 inch channel catfish, \$35.00; 6-8 inch channel catfish, \$55.00; 1-3 inch hybrid bluegill, \$40.00; 3-5 inch hybrid bluegill, \$60.00; 2-3 inch hybrid large mouth bass, \$70.00; 4-6 inch hybrid large mouth bass, \$160.00; and fathead minnows (approximately 250 per pound), \$7.00 per pound.

Delivery date is set for March 30, 1985 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. at the Coke County Courthouse parking lot.

Suggested stocking rates for small ponds are 100 channel catfish per surface acre. Channel catfish can be stocked alone or with fathead minnows to serve as forage. The larger 6-8 inch catfish fingerlings are suggested if large bass are present in the pond. Fingerlings of this size are usually fast enough to avoid being eaten by the bass.

In ponds greater than one surface acre, stocking 100 catfish, 50 bass, 500 bluegill and two pounds of fathead minnows provides a balanced stocking program.

The hybrid bluegill can be stocked alone or with bass or catfish. About 10 per cent of the blue gill will reproduce and are a good choice as forage for bass. They grow larger than native blue gill and are an excellent choice for stocking alone in very small ponds.

Plastic bags will be provided for hauling the fish. They can be kept in bags for up to two hours, but should be placed into ponds as soon as possible.

Payment is due on placement of the order with checks made payable to the

Coke County SWCD. Orders will be taken through March 21, 1985. Additional information may be obtained by calling 453-2623 or by talking to SCS personnel in the office in the Coke County Courthouse.


